SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 48

1 A RESOLUTION URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR AND SECRETARY 2 GALE NORTON TO RECONSIDER THE RULE REGARDING PERSONAL WATERCRAFT 3 USE WITHIN THE NATIONAL PARK SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, in September 1998, the National Park Service proposed regulations that would prohibit personal watercraft (PWC) use in units of the National Park System unless a determination was made that such use is appropriate based on that unit's enabling legislation, resources and values, other visitor uses and overall management objectives; and

10 WHEREAS, this proposed rule was posted in the Federal 11 Register with a sixty-day comment period and the final rule was 12 adopted and became effective on April 20, 2000; and

13 WHEREAS, the final rule allowed for a two-year grace period 14 to evaluate the impact of personal watercraft use; and

15 WHEREAS, Superintendent Eubanks of the Gulf Islands National 16 Seashore has announced that, based upon the information currently 17 available, the Seashore intends to allow the regulation 18 prohibiting the use of personal watercraft within the boundaries 19 of the Seashore to go into effect on April 22, 2002; and

20 WHEREAS, continued access by personal watercraft owners and 21 their families in our national parks is extremely important and 22 clearly intended by the National Park Service rule; and

23 WHEREAS, personal watercraft owners and their families should 24 be allowed to enjoy the beautiful scenery and recreational 25 opportunities at our lakes and seashores regardless of whether 26 they choose to do so on a personal watercraft or other type of

27 boat; and

31 WHEREAS, some national parks are banning personal watercraft 32 outright without examining options to allow for their continued 33 use and without the open and transparent process envisioned by the 34 National Park Service rule; and

35 WHEREAS, owners of personal watercraft should not be 36 discriminated against and singled out on navigable waters where 37 motorized boating is allowed; and

38 WHEREAS, Mississippi's barrier islands are unique in the fact 39 that the mode of transportation used for access to the islands is 40 predominantly by watercraft and cannot be accessed by automobiles; 41 and

42 WHEREAS, the Legislature is deeply concerned about the 43 negative economic impact these unilateral bans on personal 44 watercraft will have on the State of Mississippi:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby urge the Department of Interior and Secretary Gale Norton to reconsider the rule regarding the use of personal watercraft within the National Park System.
