REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 502: Handicap parking violation; charge dismissed upon proof to court of valid windshield placard.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows: 13 14 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 15 16 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 17 through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 18 19 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 20 21 that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 22 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a

- An applicant for a special license plate bearing the

- 73 for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.
- 74 (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable

- 76 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with
- 77 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The
- 78 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through
- 79 the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial
- 80 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a
- 81 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of

- 83 walk. These placards shall be valid for a period of three (3)
- 84 years from their date of issue and may be renewed in the same

The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 91 92 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability 93 to walk. Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by 94 this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 95 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 96 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 97 98 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 99 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 100 ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 101 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 102 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 103 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the 104 vehicle dashboard. The temporary removable windshield placard 105 shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has 106 determined that the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six (6) months from the date of issuance. The State Tax 107 Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 108 109 The removable windshield placard and the temporary 110 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include: 111 The International Symbol of Access, which is at (a) 112 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the 113 color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue 114 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be white on a red shield); 115

118 (C) A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the 119 placard by the tax collector; and

the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;

An identification number and, on the reverse side,

(d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.

(5) (a) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle does not have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in this section. Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks such spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each such violation. For the third and subsequent offenses under this section, the offender's driver's license shall be suspended for ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine imposed. The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required

to be imposed under this subsection.

(b) A person who is charged with a violation of this section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for persons who are disabled and failing properly to display a removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall have the charge dismissed upon presentation to the court of proof by means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the time of the charged violation he or a passenger in the vehicle possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this section.

- (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
- (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such

- 152 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce 153 such designated parking on private property. Only areas marked in 154 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces 155
- 156 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.
- 157 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 158 159 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 160 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 161 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 162 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard,
- 163 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 164

is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.

- 165 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are 166 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after 167 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person 168 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk. The identification required to park in such an area, except as 169
- 171 (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard 172 173 must be displayed.

provided in subsection (8) of this act, is as follows:

- 174 (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a 175 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk, 176 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary 177 windshield placard must be displayed.
- (10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or 178 other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax 179 180 Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant 181 to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is 182 registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport

comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION OF THE LAW SETTING ASIDE SPECIAL PARKING AREAS FOR PERSONS WHO ARE DISABLED SHALL NOT BE CONVICTED FOR FAILING TO DISPLAY A SPECIAL WINDSHIELD PLACARD UPON PRESENTATION TO THE COURT OF PROOF THAT AT THE TIME OF THE CHARGED VIOLATION HE OR A PASSENGER IN THE VEHICLE POSSESSED A VALID PLACARD AND TO ALLOW A NURSING HOME, RETIREMENT 7 HOME OR OTHER INSTITUTION THAT TRANSPORTS DISABLED PERSONS TO APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE ONE SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE; AND FOR RELATED 9 10 PURPOSES.
