## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1569: Appropriation; Department of Marine Resources.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 8 maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal 9 year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002...... 10 2,194,341.00. .....\$ SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of

Each political subdivision receiving funds authorized in this section shall

- 6 be held responsible for complying with Section 29-15-9, Mississippi
- 7 Code of 1972, and shall be subject to an audit by the State Auditor and shall
- 8 submit detailed reports beginning June 30, and every six (6) months
- 9 thereafter for the duration of the project to the Department of Marine
  - Resources on how funds authorized in this section were expended.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any political subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2001. All proposals submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. Multi-phased projects, multi-year projects, proposed projects with high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated.

It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of the tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be made allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this section.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Marine Resources be allowed to make necessary transfers from the Subsidies, Loans and Grants category of expenditures to any other categories of expenditures for the purpose of expending Tidelands funds as appropriated in House Bill No. 1636 of the Regular Session of 2000.

SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the

- 31 State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants
- upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the
- manner provided by law.

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SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001, except for Section 6 which shall take effect from and after passage and through June 30, 2001.
