REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1596: Appropriation; Mississippi Department of Transportation.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 36 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 37 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 38 39 Services" for Fiscal Year 2003 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2002 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 40 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2003 budget by the 41 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 42 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 43 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 44 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 45 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 46 act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 47 48 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2002 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 49 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 50 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 51 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2002 "Personal Services" 52 53 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 54 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 55 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 56 57 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

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59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 61 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 62 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

63 SECTION 3. SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of the Legislature that One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal Year 2002.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend such funds as necessary to conduct project planning. Such project planning shall apply to all preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction projects of the department and, at a minimum, shall consist of policies for the oversight and management of project cost which:

88 (i) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each
 89 project. For purposes of this provision, projects include
 90 preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and

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(ii) Capture and retain the initial project cost 92 93 estimates for comparison with final actual expenditures; (iii) Require that any changes to a cost estimate 94 95 for a project will be reviewed and approved by district or central office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing 96 97 any revision, and providing a narrative description of the reasons 98 for approving a revision; (iv) Capture the cost of consultants, engineers, 99 attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and 100 professional contractors used in preliminary engineering, 101 right-of-way acquisition and construction projects; 102 103 (v) On or before January 10 of each year, the department shall furnish the members of the Senate Highways and 104 Transportation Committee and the Transportation Committee of the 105 House of Representatives, a report which shall include, but not be 106 107 limited to, the following on each new construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation project completed for which payment has been 108 finalized during the previous fiscal year: 109 110 1. Project termini and contractor; 2. Final project cost as compared to the bid 111 112 cost; 3. Compare actual completion dates with the 113 114 bid completion date as stated in the contract; All change orders; 115 4. Length of project and cost per mile. 116 5. 117 SECTION 6. (1) Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall 118 expend such funds as necessary to compile and deliver to the 119 Legislature by January 10, 2002, the following reports on the 120 highway segments authorized under Sections 65-3-97 and 65-39-1, 121 122 Mississippi Code of 1972, and any nonprogram segments statutorily

At the conclusion of each identified highway segment, the total cost of all projects comprising the segment shall be compiled and included in the reports.

(b) A compilation of all segments which were authorized
by the Mississippi Transportation Commission. This listing shall
include:

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(i) Contract let date;

(ii) The highway on which the contract was let;
(iii) A description of the project, including the
beginning and end point;

(iv) The length of the project in miles; and
(v) Name of the contractor selected to perform
contract work;

(c) A compilation of costs for all preliminary
engineering, right-of-way and construction contracts entered
during the reporting period;

(d) A listing of all segments completed or in progressby topographical area of the state for the reporting period;

(e) A status report of highway segments to include
highway segment description, the date of construction of the road,
and the pavement condition rating utilizing the most current
available data.

(f) A report on the causes of pavement deterioration
for highways on the state highway system and any proposed remedies
for these problems.

(2) The reports required under this section shall be in addition to and shall not affect the reports specifically required under Section 65-3-97, Mississippi Code of 1972, or any other reports authorized or required by law to be prepared by the

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157 SECTION 7. (1) None of the funds appropriated under the 158 provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the 159 Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if 160 such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:

(a) The explanation and justification for letting such a
contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered upon
the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;

(b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after entry
of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives
notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of
such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation
Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the
Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation
Committee; and

(c) The commission files a report with the Legislature not later than January 10, 2002, providing the following information with regard to each contract let during the preceding calendar year for construction of each project within a highway segment:

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(i) The contract let date;

(ii) The highway on which the contract was awarded;
(iii) A description of the project, including the
beginning and end point;

(iv) The length of the project in miles; and
(v) The name of the contractor selected to perform
contract work.

SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention Program.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 192 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority 193 to escalate its budget and expend funds obtained from the "buy 194 back" option offered by equipment manufacturers and/or suppliers of certain types of equipment not to exceed One Million Dollars 195 (\$1,000,000.00) in accordance with the rules and regulations of 196 197 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. 198

199 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Transportation 200 201 may transfer between the various programs authorized in Section 3 of this act, an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the 202 203 amount appropriated in Section 1, except that no transfers shall 204 be authorized which increase the "Administration and Other Expenses" Program or which decrease the "Maintenance" Programs. 205 206 The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall submit written justification for any 207 208 transfers authorized in this Section to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or 209 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of 210 the transfer. 211

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 213 Mississippi Department of Transportation is hereby authorized to 214 receive, budget and expend in the Capital Outlay major object of 215 expenditure an amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars 216 (\$2,000,000.00) resulting from funds received from third party 217 damages.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 223 Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in 224 either the "Capital Outlay - Other Than Equipment" or "Commodities" major object of expenditure and the Maintenance 225 Program, with funds which were obligated in Fiscal Year 2001 for 226 maintenance overlay profits and maintenance repair projects but 227 not completed before the end of Fiscal Year 2001 in an amount not 228 to exceed Twelve Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars 229 (\$12,800,000.00).230

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 231 SECTION 15. Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in 232 "Capital Outlay - Other Than Equipment" major object of 233 expenditure and the Aeronautics, Rails and other program with the 234 235 funds which were obligated in Fiscal Year 2001 for rail projects but not completed before the end of Fiscal Year 2001 in an amount 236 not to exceed Three Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 237 238 (\$3,750,000.00).

SECTION 16. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 239 240 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money not expended in Fiscal Year 2001 by the Department of Transportation in the 241 242 "Capital Outlay - Equipment" category for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002..... 243 244 \$ 1,100,000.00. 245 SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall come from the Mississippi 246 Public Service Commission Special Fund 3811 and Five Hundred Fifty 247 Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) shall come from the Mississippi 248 Public Service Commission - Utility Staff Fund 3812. 249 250 SECTION 18. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

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Mississippi Department of Transportation shall reissue Payroll 251 Warrant No. 802109924 which was originally issued on April 26, 252 1995, to Wilburn L. Stephens in the amount of Six Hundred 253 254 Twenty-four Dollars and Thirty-three Cents (\$624.33) which was not 255 presented for payment within a one year period and is now void. SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 256 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 257 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 258 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 259 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 260 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 261 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from 262 263 and after July 1, 2001.
