REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled \mathtt{BILL} :

S. B. No. 2525: Crabs; revise resident and nonresident commercial crabber licenses and fees.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 12 SECTION 1. The following section shall be codified as
- 13 Section 49-15-92, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 14 49-15-92. (1) Any person who feloniously steals, takes and
- 15 carries away crab traps or the property of another used to catch
- 16 saltwater crabs from crab traps is guilty of a misdemeanor, and on
- 17 conviction shall be fined Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the
- 18 first offense; Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the second
- 19 offense; and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the third and
- 20 subsequent offenses or may be imprisoned in the county jail for a
- 21 term not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both fine and
- 22 imprisonment.
- 23 (2) This section shall not apply to any person who removes
- 24 crab traps that are illegally placed or in an illegal location.
- 25 This section shall not apply to any person who catches abandoned
- 26 crab traps in a shrimp trawl, keeps the crab traps aboard the
- 27 vessel and properly disposes of the crab traps.

28 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) It is unlawful for any person, firm or
```

- 29 corporation to engage in the commercial harvesting of crabs,
- 30 oysters, shrimp, bait shrimp or saltwater fish in marine waters
- 31 north of the CSX Railroad in Harrison and Hancock Counties except
- 32 for the taking of live bait shrimp as may be allowed by the
- 33 commission after the department conducts sampling studies.
- 34 (2) For a first offense, a violation of this section is
- 35 punishable by a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). For a
- 36 second violation and subsequent violations when such violations
- 37 are committed within three (3) years of the first offense, a
- 38 person shall be fined Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).
- 39 SECTION 3. Section 49-15-86, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 40 amended as follows:
- 41 49-15-86. * * * Each person catching or taking any saltwater
- 42 crabs in the waters of the State of Mississippi for commercial
- 43 purposes shall obtain a license from the commission and shall pay
- 44 the following annual * * * license fees:
- 45 (a) Resident fee of Seventy Dollars (\$70.00) for each
- 46 boat; * * *
- 47 <u>(b)</u> Nonresident * * * fee of <u>One Hundred Sixty Dollars</u>
- 48 <u>(\$160.00) for</u> each boat * * *;
- (c) At least one (1) person on each boat must have a
- 50 <u>crab fishermen captain's license or be named as an alternate on</u>
- 51 the captain's license. The resident captain's license fee is Five
- 52 <u>Dollars (\$5.00)</u>. The nonresident captain's license fee is Forty
- 53 <u>Dollars (\$40.00); and</u>
- 54 (d) If applicable, the commission shall establish
- 55 <u>reciprocal nonresident fees according to Section 49-15-30.</u>
- 56 * * *
- 57 SECTION 4. Section 49-15-84, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 58 amended as follows:

- 59 49-15-84. (1) The commission shall coordinate with the Gulf
- 60 Coast Research Laboratory in the development of an ordinance for
- 61 the purpose of taking Callinectes sapidus (blue crab) or allied
- 62 species. The ordinance shall include provisions for the
- 63 establishment of size limits for individual or market use as well
- 64 as establishing legal harvest size for the cultivating of peeler
- 65 crabs and soft-shell crabs.
- 66 (2) The commission shall establish minimum specifications
- 67 for crab traps and shall require buoys of adequate size which are
- 68 identified as to the owner of the buoys and traps. Within the
- 69 bays and bayous recreational crabbers may use no more than six (6)
- 70 crab traps per household. All recreational crab traps shall be
- 71 <u>attached to a fixed structure.</u> The taking of crabs with drop nets
- 72 is permitted without a license.
- 73 (3) It is unlawful to catch, hold or have in possession any
- 74 female sponge crab or any female crab bearing visible eggs at any
- 75 time within marine waters. It is not unlawful to catch those
- 76 crabs unintentionally, if the crabs are immediately returned to
- 77 the water.
- 78 SECTION 5. Section 97-17-58, Mississippi Code of 1972, which
- 79 establishes penalties for theft of crab pots, is repealed.
- 80 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 81 and after July 1, 2001.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
