REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2593: Wildlife; conform state law to federal migratory bird act.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. Section 49-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows:

49-5-7. (1) No wild bird other than a game bird or 7 introduced pheasants which are hereby classified as domestic fowl 8 shall be pursued, taken, wounded, killed, captured, possessed or 9 exported at any time, dead or alive. No part of the plumage, skin 10 or body of any bird protected by this section or of any birds 11 coming from without the state, the importation of which is 12 prohibited into the United States, shall be sold or had in 13 possession for sale in this state. 14

15 No person shall molest, take or destroy or attempt to molest, 16 take or destroy the nests or eggs of any wild bird, or have such 17 nest<u>s</u> or eggs in his possession, except under the authority of a 18 permit duly issued for scientific purposes.

(2) This section shall not apply to game birds for which
there is an open season under state law <u>or introduced pheasants;</u>
birds, or parts thereof collected or possessed under the authority
of a certificate duly issued for scientific purposes; or to the
English sparrow (Passer domesticus), red-winged blackbird
(Agelaius phoeniceus), rusty blackbird (Euphagus carolinus),
Brewer's blackbird (Euphagus cyanocephalus), grackles (Ouiscalus)

5 <u>Brewer's blackbird (Euphagus cyanocephalus)</u>, grackles (Quiscalus

sp.), brown-headed cowbird (Molothrus ater), European starling 26 27 (Sturnus vulgaris) or crows (Corvus sp.) or to the nests or eggs of such unprotected birds. Nor shall anything contained in this 28 section prohibit any person on his own land or land under his 29 30 control from killing or controlling any English sparrow (Passer domesticus), red-winged blackbird (Agelaius phoeniceus), rusty 31 blackbird (Euphagus carolinus), Brewer's blackbird (Euphagus 32 cyanocephalus), grackles (Quiscalus sp.), brown-headed cowbird 33 (Molothrus ater), European starling (Sturnus vulgaris) or crows 34 (Corvus sp.) or any bird by nature destructive of gardens, crops 35 or property of any kind when such birds are committing or about to 36 commit depredation upon ornamental or shade trees, agricultural 37 crops, livestock, or wildlife or when concentrated in such numbers 38 and manner as to constitute a health hazard or other nuisance. 39 This section does not authorize and shall not be construed to 40 authorize the killing of any migratory birds protected by the 41 Migratory Bird Treaty Act. 42

43 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from44 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-5-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CONFORM TO THE FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD TREATY ACT; AND FOR RELATED 3 PURPOSES.
