REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2959: Driver's license; revise fee, create separately set photo fee.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 63-1-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

63-1-35. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall prescribe 16 17 the form of licenses issued pursuant to this article which shall, among other features, include a driver's license number assigned 18 by the Department of Public Safety which, at the option of the 19 licensee, may or may not be the social security number of the 20 licensee. A licensee who chooses not to use his social security 21 22 number as his driver's license number shall list his social 23 security number with the department which shall cross reference 24 the social security number with the driver's license number for purposes of identification. Additionally, each license shall bear 25 a full face color photograph of the licensee in such form that the 26 27 license and the photograph cannot be separated. Such photograph 28 shall be taken so that one (1) exposure will photograph the 29 applicant and the application simultaneously on the same film.

30 The department shall use a process in the issuance of a license 31 with a color photograph which shall prevent as nearly as possible any alteration, counterfeiting, duplication, reproduction, forging 32 33 or modification of such license or the superimposition of a photograph without ready detection. Such photograph shall be 34 35 replaced * * * by the department at the time of renewal. Driver 36 licenses, including photographs appearing thereon, may be renewed 37 by electronic means according to rules and regulations promulgated by the commissioner. The Department of Public Safety may accept 38 39 bank credit cards and debit cards in payment of fees for driver license renewals that are processed by electronic means and, if 40 41 authorized by general law, may charge an additional fee for the 42 use of such cards.

43 SECTION 2. Section 63-1-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 44 amended as follows:

45 63-1-37. In the event that a license or temporary driving 46 permit issued under the provisions of this article is lost or 47 destroyed, the licensee shall obtain from the commissioner a 48 duplicate copy thereof and shall pay a fee in the amount of <u>Three</u> 49 <u>Dollars (\$3.00) plus the applicable photograph fee</u> therefor. <u>The</u> 50 license or permit shall be marked "Duplicate."

51 SECTION 3. Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 52 amended as follows:

53 63-1-43. (1) The fee for receiving the application and 54 issuing the driver's or operator's license and the fee for renewing the license shall be Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) plus the 55 applicable photograph fee for each applicant for a four-year 56 license and Three Dollars (\$3.00) plus the applicable photograph 57 58 fee for each applicant for a one-year license. All originals and 59 renewals of regular operators' licenses shall be in compliance 60 with Section 63-1-47.

61 (2) The fee for receiving the application and issuing a 62 motorcycle endorsement shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00). Motorcycle 63 endorsements shall be valid for the same period of time as the 64 applicant's operator's license.

(3) The fee for receiving the application and issuing a restricted motorcycle operator's license and the fee for renewing such license shall be <u>Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) plus the applicable</u> <u>photograph fee</u>. All originals and renewals of restricted motorcycle licenses shall be valid for a period of four (4) years, in compliance with Section 63-1-47.

71 (4) From and after January 1, 1990, every person who makes 72 application for an original license or a renewal license to operate a vehicle as a common carrier by motor vehicle, taxicab, 73 74 passenger coach, dray, contract carrier or private commercial 75 carrier as such terms are defined in Section 27-19-3, except for those vehicles for which a Class A, B or C license is required 76 77 under Article 2 of this chapter, shall, in lieu of the regular driver's license above provided for, apply for and obtain a Class 78 D commercial driver's license, the fee for which shall be 79 Twenty-three Dollars (\$23.00) plus the applicable photograph fee 80 81 for a period of four (4) years; provided, however, except as required under Article 2 of this chapter, no driver of a pickup 82 83 truck shall be required to have a commercial license regardless of 84 the purpose for which the pickup truck is used.

All originals and renewals of commercial licenses issued under this section shall be valid for a period of four (4) years, in compliance with Section 63-1-47. Only persons who operate the above-mentioned vehicles in the course of the regular and customary business of the owner shall be required to obtain a Olass D commercial operator's license, and persons operating such vehicles for private purposes or in emergencies shall not be 92 required to obtain such license.

93	(5) The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or
94	regulation, shall establish a driver's license photograph fee
95	which shall be the actual cost of the photograph rounded off to
96	the next highest dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee
97	shall be deposited into a special photograph fee account which the
98	Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of
99	producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the
100	actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the general
101	<u>fund of the State of Mississippi.</u>
102	SECTION 4. Section 63-1-82, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
103	amended as follows:
104	63-1-82. (1) Each commercial driver's license shall be
105	marked "Commercial Driver's License" or "CDL," and shall, to the
106	maximum extent practicable, be tamper proof. Each such license
107	shall include thereon, but not be limited to, the following
108	information:
109	(a) The name and residential address of the licensee;
110	(b) The licensee's color photograph;
111	(c) A physical description of the licensee, including
112	his sex, height, weight, eye and hair color;
113	(d) The licensee's date of birth;
114	(e) Except for a nonresident commercial driver's
115	license, the licensee's social security number; and any other
116	identifying information which the Commissioner of Public Safety,
117	by rule or regulation, determines necessary and essential for the
118	purposes of complying with the provisions of this article;
119	(f) The licensee's signature;
120	(g) The class or type of commercial motor vehicle or
121	vehicles which the licensee is authorized to drive together with
122	any endorsements or restrictions;

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(h) The name of this state; and

124 (i) The dates between which the license is valid. 125 (2) The holder of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all vehicles in the class for which that license is issued 126 and all lesser classes of vehicles, including any vehicle for 127 128 which an operator's license or commercial driver's license issued 129 under Article 1 of this chapter authorizes a person to drive. 130 However, vehicles which require an endorsement may not be driven 131 unless the proper endorsement appears on the license.

132 (3) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with the133 following classifications:

(a) Class A. Any combination of vehicles with a gross
vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds
or more, provided the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle
or vehicles being towed is in excess of ten thousand (10,000)
pounds;

(b) Class B. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or more, and any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds;

(c) Class C. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or any such vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds comprising:

147 (i) Vehicles designed to transport sixteen (16) or 148 more passengers, including the driver; and

(ii) Vehicles used in the transportation of hazardous materials which are required to be placarded under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 USCS Appx., Section 1801 et seq.; and

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(d) Class D. All other vehicles or combination of

154 vehicles which are not included in Class A, Class B or Class C and 155 for which a commercial license is required to be issued as 156 provided by Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.

157 (4) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with the 158 following endorsements and restrictions:

159 (a) "H" authorizes the driver to drive a vehicle 160 transporting hazardous materials;

161 (b) "K" restricts the driver to vehicles not equipped 162 with air brakes;

163 (c) "T" authorizes driving double and triple trailers; 164 (d) "P" authorizes driving vehicles carrying 165 passengers;

166 (e) "N" authorizes driving tank vehicles; and 167 (f) "X" represents a combination of hazardous materials 168 and tank vehicle endorsements.

(g) "S" restricts the driver to school buses being operated for the purpose of transporting pupils to and from school or to school-related functions and/or to all other vehicles not requiring a commercial driver's license.

173 (5) Before issuing a commercial driver's license, the
174 Commissioner of Public Safety shall obtain driving record
175 information through the Commercial Driver License Information
176 System.

(6) Within ten (10) days after issuing a commercial driver's license, the Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify the Commercial Driver License Information System of that fact, providing all information required to ensure identification of the person.

182 (7) The fee charged for the issuance of each original and
183 each renewal of a Class A, B or C commercial driver's license
184 shall be <u>Thirty-eight Dollars (\$38.00) plus the applicable</u>

185 <u>photograph fee</u>. In addition, a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall 186 be charged for each endorsement or restriction entered on a 187 commercial driver's license under subsection (4) of this section. 188 However, the fee charged for each original and renewal of a 189 commercial driver's license with an "S" restriction shall be the 190 same as the fee for a Class D commercial driver's license in 191 addition to all application fees.

192 (8) If a commercial driver instruction permit or commercial 193 driver's license is lost or destroyed, or if the holder of a 194 commercial driver's license changes his name, mailing address or 195 residence, an application for a duplicate permit or license shall be made as provided by Section 63-1-37, Mississippi Code of 1972. 196 197 (9) All commercial driver's licenses issued under the 198 provisions of this article shall be issued for a period of not 199 more than four (4) years and shall expire at midnight on the last

day of the licensee's month of birth.

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(10) Every person applying for renewal of a commercial driver's license shall complete the application form required by Section 63-1-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, providing updated information and required certifications and paying the appropriate fees. If the applicant wishes to retain a hazardous materials endorsement, the written test for a hazardous materials endorsement must be taken and passed.

208 (11) The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or 209 regulation, shall establish a driver's license photograph fee which shall be the actual cost of the photograph rounded off to 210 the next highest dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee 211 212 shall be deposited into a special photograph fee account which the 213 Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of 214 producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the 215 actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the General

216 Fund of the State of Mississippi.

217 SECTION 5. Section 45-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 218 amended as follows:

45-35-7. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, each applicant for an original identification card issued pursuant to this chapter who is entitled to issuance of such a card shall be issued a four-year card. Each card shall expire at midnight on the last day of the cardholder's birth month.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section,
all renewal identification cards shall be for four-year periods
and may be renewed any time during the birth month of the
cardholder upon application and payment of the required fee.

(3) Any applicant who is blind, as defined in Section
43-6-1, upon payment of the fee prescribed in this section, shall
be issued an original identification card which shall remain valid
for a period of ten (10) years. All renewal identification cards
issued to such persons shall also be valid for a period of ten
(10) years.

234 (4) A fee of <u>Eleven Dollars (\$11.00)</u> shall be collected for the issuance of an original or renewal identification card. 235 236 The Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or regulation, shall 237 establish a driver's license photograph fee which shall be the 238 actual cost of the photograph rounded off to the next highest 239 dollar. Monies collected for the photograph fee shall be 240 deposited into a special photograph fee account which the 241 Department of Public Safety shall use to pay the actual cost of producing the photographs. Any monies collected in excess of the 242 243 actual costs of the photography shall be deposited to the General 244 Fund of the State of Mississippi. Such fee shall be deposited 245 into the State General Fund.

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(5) Any person who, for medical reasons, surrenders his

247 unexpired driver's license, and any person whose unexpired 248 driver's license is suspended for medical reasons by the 249 Commissioner of Public Safety under Section 63-1-53(e), may be issued an identification card without payment of a fee. The 250 identification card shall be valid for a period of four (4) years 251 from its date of issue. All renewals of such card shall be 252 subject to the fee prescribed in subsection (4) of this section. 253 254 (6) The department shall maintain a record of all

255 identification cards issued, except for those cards cancelled, 256 surrendered or denied renewal.

257 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from 258 and after July 1, 2001.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
