REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3097: Appropriation; Secretary of State.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 Treasury to the credit of the Office of the Secretary of State, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by said office 8 9 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending 10 June 30, 2002.....\$ 7,829,618.00. 11 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 12 of Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be 13 expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature 6 that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds 7 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2003 do 8 not exceed Fiscal Year 2002 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless 9 programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2003 budget 10 by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative 11 Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the 12 projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance 13 with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency 14 head to insure that no single personnel action increases this projected 15 annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2002 appropriation for "Personal 16 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, the State 17 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken action(s) which 18 would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal 19 Year 2002 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then 20 only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the 21 appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board 22 until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 23

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

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SECTION 3. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall be

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expended for any purpose that is not actually required or necessary for
performing any of the powers or duties of the Office of the Secretary of
State that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or
federal law, or rules or regulations that implement state or federal law.

SECTION 4. No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be used
 either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any clerk,

stenographer, assistant, deputy, or other person who may be related by 37 blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by the rules of the civil 38 law, to the official employing or having the right of employment or selection 39 thereof; and in the event of any such payment, then the official or person 40 approving and making or receiving such payment shall be jointly and 41 severally liable to return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State 42 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received, to be 43 recovered at suit of the Attorney General; provided that when the 44 relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the relationship was 45 established is dead, this provision shall not apply. 46

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Secretary of 47 State shall have the authority to accept proceeds and revenues from fines, 48 awards, or settlements produced by administrative or court actions involving 49 the enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act and the Regulation of 50 Charitable Solicitations Act. Such funds are to be escalated in accordance 51 with procedures for federal fund escalations as established in Section 52 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and expended for the purposes of 53 enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act and the regulation of the 54 Charitable Solicitations Act in accordance with applicable rules and 55 regulations of the State Fiscal Officer. It is the intention of the Legislature 56 that the funds deposited to the Securities Enforcement Act and Regulation 57

of Charitable Solicitations Act Fund be maintained separate and apart from
other special funds derived from fees charged by the Secretary of State and
shall remain in that fund to be used by the Secretary of State as authorized
herein.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Secretary of 62 State shall have the authority to accept proceeds and revenues from the 63 sale of tax forfeited properties in accordance with Section 29-1-95. These 64 funds shall be deposited into a Special Fund in the State Treasury called the 65 Land Records Maintenance Fund. Such funds are to be escalated in 66 accordance with procedures for federal fund escalations as established in 67 Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and expended for the 68 purposes of preserving state land records and disposition of tax forfeited 69 properties in accordance with applicable rules and regulations of the State 70 Fiscal Officer. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds deposited 71 to the Land Records Maintenance Fund be maintained separate and apart 72 from other Special Funds derived from fees charged by the Secretary of 73 State and shall remain in that fund to be used by the Secretary of State as 74 authorized herein. 75

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Secretary of 76 State shall have the authority to accept proceeds and revenues from the 77 lease rentals of tidelands and submerged lands in accordance with Section 78 29-1-107, Mississippi Code of 1972. These funds shall be deposited into a 79 special fund in the State Treasury called the Public Trust Tidelands Fund. 80 Such funds are to be escalated in accordance with procedures for federal 81 fund escalations as established in Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 82 1972, and expended for the purposes of managing the state tidelands and 83 submerged lands in accordance with applicable rules and regulations of the 84

State Fiscal Officer. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds 85 deposited to the Public Trust Tidelands Fund be maintained separate and 86 apart from other special funds derived from fees charged by the Secretary of 87 State and shall be used by the Secretary of State as authorized herein. 88 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the 89 State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the 90 proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the 91 State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants 92 upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the 93 manner provided by law. 94

SECTION 9 This act shall take effect and be in force from and after
July 1, 2001.
