## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3118: Appropriation; IHL - MSU -Cooperative Extension Service.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2002.
10	\$ 20,645,079.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any

special source funds which are collected by or otherwise become 13 available for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 14 15 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002..... \$ 17 15,710,962.00. SECTION 3. No general funds authorized to be expended 18 19 herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under 20 21 the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer

22 available.

23 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 24 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the 25 emphasis areas of Agriculture, Home Economics, 4-H, and Community 26 Resource Development in each county.

27 SECTION 5. No part of the funds appropriated or authorized 28 to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for 29 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who 30 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service 31 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of 32 Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such 33 legal services.

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SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

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35 agency's budget request for fiscal year 2003 shall be submitted 36 to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level 37 of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 38 during the Fiscal Year 2002 budget request process.

39 SECTION 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that if the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly or 40 41 indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants, 42 research grants or donations, such special source funds not 43 classified as current restricted funds shall be added and 44 accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the 45 intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special 46 source funds be included in all reports and requests for the 2001 Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature. 47

48 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One 49 Million Two Hundred Eighty-six Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-three 50 Dollars (\$1,286,943.00) shall be derived from the Education 51 Enhancement Fund from funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-52 75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

53 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 54 of Section 2, One Million Four Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars 55 (\$1,460,000.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund 56 created in Senate Bill No. 2680, Regular Session of 2001.

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57	SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance		
58	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of		
59	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized		
60	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve		
61	the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding		
62	authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the		
63	targeted performance measures provided below:
