REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3123: Appropriation; Dept. of Corrections - Support and Reimb. Local Confinement.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Mississippi Department of Corrections for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002....

If, at the end of any calendar month, 130 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 131 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 132 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2002 "Personal Services" 133 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions 134 which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 135 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 136 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 137 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance 138 with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law. 139 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 140 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which 141 are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of 142 this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 143 SECTION 4. With the funds provided herein, the Mississippi 144 Department of Corrections (MDOC) shall provide a written report to the Chairman of the Mississippi House of Representatives, 145

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Senate Appropriations and Corrections Committees on the 147 148 operational feasibility of Units 10, 12, 20, 22 and 23 at the 149 Mississippi State Penitentiary at Parchman, Mississippi. 150 report shall be finalized and received by the Committee Chairmen 151 on or before January 1, 2002. 152 SECTION 5. As a condition for the authority to expend funds pursuant to Sections 1 and 2 of this act, the Commissioner of the 153 154 Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) and each regional 155 correctional facility and private prison shall cooperate with and 156 provide all pertinent information to the Joint Legislative 157 Committee on Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review (PEER) 158 in order for the PEER Committee to determine the necessary per 159 diem, per inmate cost associated with the housing of state 160 inmates at each of the regional correctional facilities and 161 private prisons. In no case shall the aggregate per diem costs 162 of housing state inmates at regional facilities or private 163 prisons exceed the aggregate appropriation for the regional facilities, private prisons or the maximum amounts set by law in 164 165 Sections 47-5-933 and 47-5-1211, Mississippi Code of 1972. 166 the necessary per diem, per inmate cost is determined, and reported to the Chairmen of the Mississippi House of 167

Representatives, Appropriations and Penitentiary Committees and

- 169 the Mississippi Senate Appropriations and Corrections Committees,
- 170 the Commissioner of the MDOC shall make payments for housing not
- 171 less than two hundred thirty (230) inmates at each regional
- 172 facility, not less than nine hundred (900) state inmates at the
- 173 Delta Correctional Facility and not less than nine hundred (900)
- 174 state inmates at the Marshall County Correctional Facility.
- 175 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 176 Department of Corrections may use any federal funds that may
- 177 become available for the construction of a certified fail-safe
- 178 lethal/non-lethal fencing system at any of its maximum security
- 179 units for that purpose.
- 180 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 181 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention
- 182 of the Legislature that any contractual service payments made by
- 183 the department to defray medical expenses for inmates shall be at
- 184 the currently established Medicaid reimbursement rate; however,
- 185 if hospital and medical providers will not contract at the
- 186 Medicaid reimbursement rate, the Department of Corrections may
- 187 enter into a negotiated contract.
- 188 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 189 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the
- 190 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the

department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities furnished to said housing, except that the

195 may be provided with a housing expense allowance in lieu of being
196 furnished with a dwelling house. The Department of Corrections

Superintendent of the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility

furnished with a dwelling house. The Department of Corrections

shall not pay for the installation or monthly service of any

198 telephone installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney

SECTION 10. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the Governor in each specific case.

209 SECTION 11. None of the money herein appropriated shall be 210 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, 211 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an 212 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State

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Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually 213 214 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance 215 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General 216 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 217 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being 218 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 219 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated. 220 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above 221 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive 222 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence action to recover the monies so paid to said person and 223 224 to enjoin the further employment of said person at the 225 Mississippi Department of Corrections. 226 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 227 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may 228 transfer between the divisions of Support, Medical Services, 229 Parole Board, Farming Operations, Private Prisons, Regional 230 Facilities and Local Confinement, both funds and positions not to exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the authorized budgets in the 231 232 aggregate. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer 233 234 to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance

235 and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior 236 to the effective date of the transfer. It is further the 237 intention of the Legislature that no transfer may be made under 238 the provisions of this section to increase or decrease the 239 salaries category of any budget set forth in the original 240 appropriations made under this act, but may be used to contract 241 with counties to house state inmates in facilities authorized by 242 Section 47-5-931, Mississippi Code of 1972. It is further the 243 intention of the Legislature that any transfers made under the 244 provisions of this paragraph shall be for the removal of state 245 inmates from county jails or of an emergency nature.

SECTION 13. It is the intent of the Legislature that all prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those incarcerated in maximum security.

SECTION 14. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

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SECTION 16. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby 7 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the 8 Working Cash/Stabilization Reserve Fund, to the Mississippi Department of 9 Corrections, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001\$ 16,400,000.00. 10 It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds appropriated in this 11 section shall be considered a portion of the Fifty Million Dollars 12 (\$50,000,000.00) authorized in Section 27-103-203, Mississippi Code of 13 1972, for the Governor to transfer from the Working Cash/Stabilization 14 Reserve Fund to the State General Fund to provide for revenue shortfalls. 15 SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the 16 State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the 17 proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the 18 State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants 19 upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the 20 manner provided by law. 21 SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after 22 July 1, 2001, except that Section 16 shall take effect and be in force from 23 and after its passage. 24
