# By Representative(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
8	(a) <u>"Covered individual" means a law enforcement</u>
9	officer or firefighter as defined in this section when employed by
10	an employer as defined in this section; it does not include
11	employees of independent contractors. "Covered individual" also
12	includes volunteer firefighters.
13	(b) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
14	department, division, bureau, or agency, or a county, municipality
15	or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
16	appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.
17	(c) "Firefighter" means an individual who is trained
18	for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
19	fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to fire-fighting
20	activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
21	emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials

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#### or other emergency incident.

23 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn 24 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of 25 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to 26 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain 27 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing, 28 or convicted of a crime.

(2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a 29 30 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Ten 31 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) when a law enforcement officer, 32 while engaged in the performance of the person's official duties, 33 is accidentally or intentionally killed or receives accidental or 34 intentional bodily injury that results in the loss of the covered 35 individual's life, provided that the killing is not the result of 36 suicide and that the bodily injury is not intentionally 37 self-inflicted.

38 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall make a payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Five 39 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) when a firefighter, while engaged in 40 the performance of the person's official duties, is accidentally 41 or intentionally killed or receives accidental or intentional 42 43 bodily injury that results in loss of the covered individual's 44 life, provided that the killing is not the result of suicide and 45 that the bodily injury is not intentionally self-inflicted. 46  $(\underline{c})$  The payment provided for under paragraph (a) of 47 this subsection shall be made to the beneficiary who was

48 designated in writing by the <u>covered individual</u>, signed by the 49 <u>covered individual</u> and delivered to the employer during the 50 <u>covered individual's</u> lifetime. If no such designation is made, 51 then the payment shall be made to the **\* \* \*** surviving child or

52 children and spouse in equal portions, and if there is no 53 surviving child or spouse, then to the **\* \* \*** parent or parents. 54 If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no surviving 55 child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made to the 56 <u>covered individual's</u> estate.

57 (<u>d</u>) The payment made under paragraph (a) of this 58 subsection is in addition to any workers' compensation or pension 59 benefits and is exempt from the claims and demands of creditors of 60 the <u>covered individual</u>.

(3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement <u>Officer and</u>
<u>Firefighters</u> Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
any other source.

(b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121, and those investments shall be subject to the limitations prescribed by Section 25-11-121.

(c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund.

(4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section,

82 to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry 83 out the purposes of this section.

84 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 85 and after July 1, 2001.
