Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

49-7-153. (1) Any resident may purchase a lifetime 8 sportsman hunting and fishing license by filing an application in 9 10 the office of the department. The license shall qualify the 11 licensee to take all fish, game and fowl, except waterfowl, including deer and turkey, in the manner provided by law. The 12 license shall also permit the licensee to hunt with primitive 13 weapons and bow and arrow, and to * * * fish in the public waters 14 15 of the state, including the taking of crabs, oysters, shrimp and any saltwater fish authorized to be taken under a recreational 16 17 license.

18 (2) The department may issue a <u>resident</u> lifetime sportsman
19 license at a fee to be determined by the commission at an amount
20 not less than <u>One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)</u> for a person
21 <u>thirteen (13)</u> years of age <u>or older and</u> not less than <u>Five Hundred</u>
22 <u>Dollars (\$500.00)</u> for a person * * * under <u>thirteen (13)</u> years of

age. * * * All lifetime licenses shall be issued from the office of the department. Each application for a lifetime license must be accompanied by a certified copy of the birth certificate of the individual to be named as the license holder, if the individual is twelve (12) years of age or under.

28 (3) The commission shall establish proof of residency requirements for the purchase of a lifetime license, and shall 29 30 also establish such restrictions on and regulations for lifetime 31 licenses as it deems necessary and proper. An applicant for a 32 resident lifetime license must have been domiciled in this state 33 for eighteen (18) consecutive months immediately preceding the 34 date of his application for a license. The burden of proving 35 domicile shall be on the applicant.

36 (4) * * * (a) The department may issue a native son or daughter nonresident lifetime sportsman hunting and fishing 37 license. The commission shall establish the fee, but the fee 38 39 shall not be less than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). The applicant must provide a certified copy of the 40 41 original birth certificate showing that the applicant was born in 42 Mississippi and/or if the parents' address was in Mississippi at 43 the time of birth as shown on the birth certificate or other 44 documents and/or official documents reflect that one of said 45 parents was on active military service outside the State of 46 Mississippi at the time of said birth. Further, if the birth 47 certificate of each parent reflects that each parent was born in the State of Mississippi, then any child born outside the State of 48 Mississippi of those parents may be issued a nonresident lifetime 49 sportsman license for the above set out fee. 50

51 (5) Any materially false statement contained in an 52 application for a lifetime license renders void the license issued 53 pursuant to that application, and subjects the applicant to 54 criminal prosecution under Section 49-7-45.

(6) Nothing in this section exempts an applicant for a lifetime license from meeting other qualifications or requirements otherwise established by law for the privilege of hunting or fishing.

59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after its passage.
