- 22 his duties, at the expense of the department, shall attend and
- 23 complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement
- 24 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or
- 25 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements
- 26 of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training.
- 27 Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to
- 28 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law
- 29 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and
- 30 trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement.
