Adopted AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill NO. 396

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

24	SECTION 1. The State Department of Education, with the
25	cooperation of the State Veterans' Affairs Board, shall devise and
26	implement a program which awards full high school diplomas to
27	qualifying World War II and Korean Conflict veterans. The purpose
28	of the program is to award high school diplomas to World War II
29	and Korean Conflict veterans who left high school prior to
30	graduation to enter United States military service. The
31	department and the board shall jointly develop an application
32	procedure, distribute applications and publicize the program. All
33	honorably discharged World War II and Korean Conflict veterans who
34	are residents or former residents of the state, who served between
35	September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1946, or who served on active
36	duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during the Korean
37	Conflict, and who did not return to school and complete their
38	education after the war shall be eligible to receive a diploma.
39	Diplomas may be issued posthumously. Upon approval of an
40	application, the local school board shall issue a standard high

- school diploma for an eligible veteran from the veteran's school of attendance or from the existing high school which the veteran would have attended. The diploma shall clearly indicate that the recipient is a veteran of World War II or the Korean Conflict and that the diploma was issued at a later date due to the veteran's participation in the war. The State Department of Education and the State Veteran Affairs Board shall work together to provide communities with information about hosting a diploma ceremony on or around Veterans Day. The diploma shall be mailed to the veteran or, if the veteran is deceased, to the veteran's family. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
 - Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, WITH THE COOPERATION OF THE STATE VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD, TO DEVISE AND IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM WHICH AWARDS FULL HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS TO QUALIFYING WORLD WAR II AND KOREAN CONFLICT VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, during the 1940's and 1950's, thousands of young men and women across the United States left high school to serve valorously in the armed forces during World War II and the Korean Conflict; and

WHEREAS, the sacrifices of these young men and women earned America its freedom, helped the United States gain status as a superpower, and shaped the course of history throughout the entire world; and

WHEREAS, after World War II and the Korean Conflict ended, many of these brave veterans were unable to finish high school for various reasons, but they led productive lives and served their communities throughout their lifetimes; and

WHEREAS, awarding high school diplomas to qualifying World War II and Korean Conflict veterans would be a small and overdue gesture of our society's profound gratitude for the sacrifice these courageous individuals made in the name of freedom; NOW, THEREFORE,
