Adopted AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill NO. 440

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 13 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 14 15 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 16 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 17 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument 18 should be established and maintained as a symbol of the recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 19 20 Mississippi veterans.

21 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 22 reenacted as follows:

55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws,
1977, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership
of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease
serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of
Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi

28 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 29 (7) members:

30 (a) The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans
31 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the
32 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission;

33 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans34 Affairs Board;

35 (c) The Director of the Division of General Services in36 the Department of Finance and Administration;

37 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one
38 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as
39 follows:

40 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II;
41 (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and
42 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict;

One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 43 (e) 44 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. The initial meeting of the commission shall be called 45 (2) and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 46 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a 47 chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission 48 49 shall elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at 50 the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings 51 of the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along 52 with all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of 53 the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All 54 actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission 55 56 shall be by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea 57 and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the

58 chairman and secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, 59 shall be binding upon the commission.

60 The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans (3) 61 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion 62 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 63 64 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while 65 on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 66 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 67 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as 68 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. 69 Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel 70 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 71 than twelve (12) meetings per year.

(4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
Veterans Memorial Commission.

76 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
77 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
78 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

79 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall 80 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi 81 82 veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so 83 that such commission can provide for the design, construction and 84 dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated 85 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission. 86

87 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

88 reenacted as follows:

89 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 90 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and 91 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans 92 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in 93 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

94 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 95 reenacted as follows:

96 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission 97 shall:

98 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
99 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
100 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the
101 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.
102 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into
103 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted and amended as follows:

112 55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 113 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from 114 individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 115 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 116 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans 117 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited

118 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the 119 Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the 120 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the 121 veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five 122 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the 123 designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans 124 125 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for 126 purposes of this section. Any monies remaining unexpended or 127 unencumbered in the fund upon completion of the monument shall 128 revert to the Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of the veterans monument and memorials. 129

130 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
131 reenacted as follows:

132 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 133 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 134 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission 135 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 136 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 137 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and 138 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 139 140 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of 141 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 142 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 143 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate 144 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 145 146 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 147 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature;

148 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty 149 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission 150 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund 151 grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds 152 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 153 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument.

154 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 155 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 156 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 157 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh 158 Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.

159 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 160 reenacted as follows:

161 55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 162 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 163 164 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and 165 provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of 166 Honor. In planning the design, construction and dedication of the 167 168 monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private 169 170 monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor 171 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 172 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The 173 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust 174 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All 175 funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for 176 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 177 monument.

178 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 179 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 180 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 181 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 182 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

183 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 184 amended as follows:

185 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through <u>55-15-62</u>, Mississippi
 186 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
 187 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, <u>2002</u>.
 188 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from

189 and after July 1, 2001.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-62, 1 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS 2 3 MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-59, 4 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT APPROPRIATED FUNDS AND 5 б FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND MAY BE USED 7 FOR THE DEDICATION OF THE VETERANS MONUMENT; TO AMEND SECTION 8 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE REPEAL DATE ON THE REENACTED CODE SECTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9
