Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

9 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the 11 State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 12 13 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 14 through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 15 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 16 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 17 18 that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 19 20 licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 21 22 walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 23 will have the disability for at least three (3) years. The State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of 24 25 the various counties, decals for placement on the special license

- 26 plates. The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the
- 27 license plate was issued and the year in which the special license
- 28 plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this
- 29 section is valid for the period of time that the license tag
- 30 attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section
- 31 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued
- 32 may retain the special license plate and may renew it by
- 33 submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its
- 34 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the
- 35 physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the
- 36 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs
- 37 the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the
- 38 disability for at least three (3) years. If an applicant fails to
- 39 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration,
- 40 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county
- 41 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a
- 42 regular license plate to replace the special license plate.
- The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this
- 44 section, includes motorcycles.
- The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the
- 46 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons
- 47 who, as determined by a licensed physician:
- 48 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping
- 49 to rest; or
- 50 (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
- 51 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
- 52 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or
- (c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent
- 54 that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one
- 55 (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1)

- liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60)
- 57 mm/hg on room air at rest; or
- (d) Use portable oxygen; or
- (e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the
- 60 person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
- 61 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
- 62 Heart Association; or
- (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due
- 64 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.
- An applicant for a special license plate bearing the
- 66 International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any
- 67 fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from
- 68 or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem
- 69 taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid
- 70 for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.
- 71 (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable
- 72 windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and
- 73 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with
- 74 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The
- 75 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through
- 76 the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial
- 77 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a
- 78 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of
- 79 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to
- 80 walk. These placards shall be valid for a period of three (3)
- 81 years from their date of issue and may be renewed in the same
- 82 manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates
- 83 under subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield
- 84 placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle
- 85 dashboard. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement

- 86 for motorcycles.
- 87 (3) The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance
- 88 of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application
- 89 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability
- 90 to walk. Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by
- 91 this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and
- 92 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices
- 93 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a
- 94 temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the
- 95 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the
- 96 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the
- 97 ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period
- 98 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the
- 99 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable
- 100 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the
- 101 vehicle dashboard. The temporary removable windshield placard
- 102 shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has
- 103 determined that the applicant will have the disability, not to
- 104 exceed six (6) months from the date of issuance. The State Tax
- 105 Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles.
- 106 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary
- 107 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:
- 108 (a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at
- 109 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the
- 110 color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue
- 111 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be
- 112 white on a red shield);
- (b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,
- 114 the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;
- 115 (c) A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the

- 116 placard by the tax collector; and
- 117 (d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.
- 118 (5) (a) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an
- 119 area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle
- 120 does not have displayed the removable windshield placard
- 121 authorized in this section. Any person who unlawfully parks a
- 122 motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks such spaces or access
- 123 thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 124 thereof, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars
- 125 (\$200.00) for each such violation. For the third and subsequent
- 126 offenses under this section, the offender's driver's license shall
- 127 be suspended for ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public
- 128 Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine
- 129 imposed. The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required
- 130 to be imposed under this subsection.
- (b) A person who is charged with a violation of this
- 132 <u>section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for</u>
- 133 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display a
- 134 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle shall not
- 135 be convicted and shall have the charge dismissed upon presentation
- 136 to the court of proof by means of sworn oral testimony or sworn
- 137 <u>affidavit that at the time of the charged violation he or a</u>
- 138 passenger in the vehicle possessed a valid removable windshield
- 139 placard issued under this section.
- 140 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special
- 141 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with
- 142 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the
- 143 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained,
- 144 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be
- 145 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

- 146 (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce
 147 this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces
 148 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such
 149 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce
 150 such designated parking on private property. Only areas marked in
 151 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility
- 152 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces
- 153 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.
- 154 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate,
- 155 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit
- 156 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with
- 157 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of
- 158 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges
- 159 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard,
- 160 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and
- 161 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- 162 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
- 163 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
- 164 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
- 165 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
- 166 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
- 167 provided in subsection (8) of this act, is as follows:
- 168 (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
- 169 permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
- 170 must be displayed.
- (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
- 172 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
- 173 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
- 174 windshield placard must be displayed.
- 175 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

176 and after July 1, 2001.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION OF THE
LAW SETTING ASIDE SPECIAL PARKING AREAS FOR PERSONS WHO ARE
DISABLED SHALL NOT BE CONVICTED FOR FAILING TO DISPLAY A SPECIAL
WINDSHIELD PLACARD UPON PRESENTATION TO THE COURT OF PROOF THAT AT
THE TIME OF THE CHARGED VIOLATION HE OR A PASSENGER IN THE VEHICLE
POSSESSED A VALID PLACARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
