2	SECTION *. Section 97-9-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
3	amended as follows:
4	97-9-73. $(1)$ It shall be unlawful for any person to
5	obstruct or resist by force, or violence, or threats, or in any
6	other manner, his lawful arrest or the lawful arrest of another
7	person by any state, local or federal law enforcement officer, and
8	any person or persons so doing shall be guilty of a misdemeanor,
9	and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not
10	more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in
11	the county jail not more than six (6) months, or both.
12	(2) The driver of a motor vehicle who is given a visible or
13	audible signal by a law enforcement officer by hand, voice,
14	emergency light or siren directing the driver to bring his motor
15	vehicle to a stop when such signal is given by a law enforcement
16	officer acting in the lawful performance of duty who has a
17	reasonable suspicion to believe that the driver in question has
18	committed a crime, and who willfully fails to obey such direction,
19	shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be
20	punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)

- 21 or imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1)
- 22 year, or both. It shall not be unlawful for a person driving a
- 23 motor vehicle after dusk to proceed to the nearest well-lit
- 24 populated public area or to the person's home before stopping as
- 25 long as the driver does not exceed the speed limit.
