## \*\*\*Adopted\*\*\* AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill NO. 1109

## By Senator(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Human Services, Division of Youth Services, shall establish a pilot program to be known as 8 the "Amer-I-Can Program." The program is designed for youths who 9 have been committed to or are confined in Columbia or Oakley 10 11 Training Schools. The objectives of this program are: 12 (a) To develop greater self-esteem, assume responsible attitudes and experience a restructuring of habits and 13 14 conditioning processes; (b) To develop an appreciation of family members and an 15 16 understanding of the role family structure has in achieving successful living; 17 18 (c) To develop an understanding of the concept of community and collective responsibility; 19 (d) To develop a prowess in problem solving and 20 21 decision making that will eliminate many of the difficulties that

(e) To develop skills in money management and financial

were encountered in past experiences;

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- 24 stability, thus relieving pressures that have contributed to
- 25 previous difficulties;
- 26 (f) To develop communication skills to better express
- 27 thoughts and ideas while acquiring an understanding of, and
- 28 respect for, the thoughts and ideas of others; and
- 29 (g) To acquire employment seeking and retention skills
- 30 to improve chances of long-term, gainful employment.
- 31 (2) The Division of Youth Services shall develop policies
- 32 and procedures to administer the program and shall choose which
- 33 youths are eligible to participate in the program.
- 34 (3) The department may accept any funds, public or private,
- 35 made available to it for the program.
- 36 (4) Before December 1, 2002, the Division of Youth Services
- 37 shall prepare a report on the effectiveness of the pilot program
- 38 to be submitted to the chairmen of the Juvenile Justice Committees
- 39 of the House of Representatives and Senate. The report shall
- 40 include information concerning the number of youths ordered to
- 41 participate in the program and the rate of recidivism of youths
- 42 successfully completing the program. The department shall address
- 43 whether or not the Amer-I-Can Program should become a permanent
- 44 program and whether or not it should be considered as an
- 45 alternative program in each school district.
- 46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 47 and after July 1, 2001, and shall stand repealed July 2, 2001.
