137	SECTION 7. With the funds herein appropriated, it is the
138	intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Education is
139	hereby authorized to provide salary increases for teachers,
140	teacher assistants and locally paid teachers in such a manner that
141	each teacher with less than twenty-five (25) years of teaching
142	experience shall receive an increase of Five Hundred Dollars
143	(\$500.00) to their base salary, each teacher with twenty-five (25)

- 144 or more years of teaching experience shall receive an increase of
- One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to their base salary, each
- 146 teacher assistant shall receive an increase of Two Hundred Fifty
- 147 Dollars (\$250.00) to their base salary, and each public school
- 148 district shall receive an increase of One Hundred Thirty-six
- 149 Dollars (\$136.00) for supportive services allotments.
- 150 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 151 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 152 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 153 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 154 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 155 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 156 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 157 and after July 1, 2001.
