Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002
10	\$ 19,212,385.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002
18	\$ 11,662,536.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement

22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State				
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth				
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of				
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,				
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.				
27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall				
28	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.				
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into				
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such				
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."				
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of				
33	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall

- 88 not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00).
- 89 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State
- 90 Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the
- 91 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with
- 92 funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource
- 93 Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred
- 94 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is
- 95 hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and
- 96 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in
- 97 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et
- 98 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 99 SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 100 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 101 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 102 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 103 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 104 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

132	funds that become available to the commission. This escalation		
133	shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the		
134	Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent		
135	with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be us	sed	
136	to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme		
137	wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.		
138	The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds		
139	shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written		
140	notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal

- 145 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 146 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 147 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 148 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 149 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 150 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 151 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 152 and after July 1, 2001.
