## HOUSE BILL NO. 14

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A 1 STUDY ON OBESITY AND ITS EFFECTS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO SUBMIT A WRITTEN REPORT DETAILING ITS FINDINGS TO THE 2 3 4 LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) This act shall be known as the "Obesity 6 Impact Study." 7 (2) For the purposes of this section, the following words 8 9 and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in this section 10 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: "Obese" means excessively fat. 11 (a) "Obesity" means an increase in body weight beyond 12 (b) the limitation of skeletal and physical requirement, as the result 13 of an excessive accumulation of fat in the body. 14 (c) "Morbid obesity" means the condition of weighing 15 two (2) or three (3), or more, times the ideal weight. 16 17 (3) The Mississippi State Department of Health (department) shall conduct a study on the effects of obesity in adults and 18 children for the purpose of identifying factors that have a 19 negative impact on their health and well-being and making 20 recommendations for improvement in awareness of the problem of 21 obesity and suggested treatment. The department shall also 22 explore means to decrease the number of residents effected by 23 obesity. The study shall include, but not be limited to, the 24 following components: 25 (a) A statement of the number of residents that are 26

26 (a) A statement of the number of residents that are 27 affected by obesity and the reasons for this condition;

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(b) An exploration of the causal relationship that
exists between obesity and serious, life threatening disorders
such as: hypertension, dyslipidemia, cardiovascular disease,
diabetes, gallbladder disease, respiratory dysfunction, gout,
osteoarthritis, and other health problems;

33 (c) An estimation of the amount of money spent on34 health problems caused by obesity;

35 (d) The potential for a reduction in health care36 expenditures through obesity prevention efforts;

37 (e) The effects of obesity in children on their overall38 health and the health care costs for treatment; and

39 (f) Recommendations for a program that would heighten
40 awareness about obesity and its related health effects and to
41 discourage behavior that leads to obesity.

42 (4) Before December 15, 2002, the department shall submit a
43 written report detailing the results of its study and recommending
44 any legislation necessary for the implementation of its proposals
45 to the Legislature.

46 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 47 and after its passage.
