- SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 10
- 11 63-3-120, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 63-3-120. "Fire fighter" means any person who is employed as 12
- a fire fighter or who serves as a fire fighter for any 13
- municipality, county or fire district in the state, whether or not 14
- compensation is provided for such employment or service and 15
- whether or not such employment or service is on a full-time, 16
- part-time or voluntary basis. 17
- SECTION 2. Section 63-3-203, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 18
- amended as follows: 19
- 63-3-203. (1) No person shall wilfully fail or refuse to 20
- comply with any lawful order or direction of any police officer or 21
- fire fighter invested by law with authority to direct, control, or 22
- regulate traffic. 23
- (2) A fire fighter may direct, control and regulate traffic 24
- 25 when necessary to provide for public safety at the scene of any
- vehicle accident. 26
- SECTION 3. Section 63-3-313, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 27
- 28 amended as follows:
- 63-3-313. No driver of a vehicle shall disobey the 29

instructions of any official traffic-control device placed in 30

- 31 accordance with the provisions of this chapter, unless at the time
- 32 otherwise directed by a police officer or fire fighter.
- 33 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 34 and after July 1, 2002.
