## HOUSE BILL NO. 117

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 67-3-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR THE HOLDER OF A PERMIT TO 2 3 SELL BEER OR LIGHT WINE AT RETAIL TO ALLOW PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 21 NOT IN THE COMPANY OF A PARENT, GUARDIAN OR SPOUSE WHO IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS OF AGE ON THE LICENSED PREMISES OF AN ESTABLISHMENT 4 5 WHERE LIGHT WINE, BEER OR DISTILLED SPIRITS ARE ALLOWED TO BE 6 CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES UNLESS SUCH ESTABLISHMENT IS REGULARLY 7 USED FOR THE SERVING OF MEALS TO GUESTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 67-3-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 11 amended as follows:

12 67-3-53. In addition to any act declared to be unlawful by 13 this chapter, or by Sections 27-71-301 through 27-71-347, and 14 Sections 67-3-17, 67-3-27, 67-3-29 and 67-3-57, it shall be 15 unlawful for the holder of a permit authorizing the sale of beer 16 or light wine at retail or for the employee of the holder of such

a permit:

18 (a) To sell or give to be consumed in or upon any licensed premises any beer or light wine between the hours of 19 midnight and seven o'clock the following morning or during any 20 time the licensed premises may be required to be closed by 21 municipal ordinance or order of the board of supervisors; 22 provided, however, in areas where the sale of alcoholic beverages 23 is legal under the provisions of the Local Option Alcoholic 24 Beverage Control Law and the hours for selling such alcoholic 25 beverages have been extended beyond midnight for on-premises 26 permittees under Section 67-1-37, the hours for selling beer or 27 28 light wines are likewise extended in areas where the sale of beer and light wines is legal in accordance with the provisions of this 29

30 chapter.

31 (b) To sell, give or furnish any beer or light wine to 32 any person visibly or noticeably intoxicated, or to any insane 33 person, or to any habitual drunkard, or to any person under the 34 age of twenty-one (21) years.

35 (c) To permit in the premises any lewd, immoral or36 improper entertainment, conduct or practices.

37 (d) To permit loud, boisterous or disorderly conduct of
38 any kind upon the premises or to permit the use of loud musical
39 instruments if either or any of the same may disturb the peace and
40 quietude of the community wherein such business is located.

41 (e) To permit persons of ill repute, known criminals,
42 prostitutes or minors to frequent the licensed premises, except
43 minors accompanied by parents or guardians, or under proper
44 supervision.

(f) To permit or suffer illegal gambling or the
operation of illegal games of chance upon the licensed premises.

47 (g) To receive, possess or sell on the licensed
48 premises any beverage of any kind or character containing more
49 than five percent (5%) of alcohol by weight unless the licensee
50 also possesses an on-premises permit under the Local Option
51 Alcoholic Beverage Control Law.

52 (h) To allow any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years not in the company of a parent, guardian or spouse who 53 is at least twenty-one (21) years of age upon the licensed 54 55 premises of an establishment where beer, light wine or distilled spirits are allowed to be consumed on the premises unless such 56 57 establishment is regularly used and kept open for the serving of meals to guests for compensation and which has suitable seating 58 59 facilities for guests. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60
