HOUSE BILL NO. 120

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-541, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT NO STATE COURT SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO EXTEND 3 VOTING HOURS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 23-15-541, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

[Until Laws, 1993, Chapter 528, is effectuated under Section
5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, this section reads as
follows:]

23-15-541. At all elections, the polls shall be opened at 10 seven o'clock in the morning and be kept open until seven o'clock 11 in the evening and no longer. No state court shall have the 12 13 authority to extend the hours that the polls shall be open. Upon the opening of the polls, and not before, the managers of the 14 15 election shall designate two (2) of their number, other than the manager theretofore designated to receive the blank ballots, who 16 shall thereupon be known respectively as the initialing manager 17 18 and the alternate initialing manager. The alternate initialing manager, in the absence of the initialing manager, shall perform 19 all of the duties and undertake all of the responsibilities of the 20 21 initialing manager. When any person entitled to vote shall appear to vote, he shall first sign his name in a receipt book or booklet 22 provided for that purpose and to be used at that election only and 23 said receipt book or booklet shall be used in lieu of the list of 24 voters who have voted formerly made by the managers or clerks; 25 26 whereupon and not before, the initialing manager or, in his 27 absence, the alternate initialing manager shall indorse his

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initials on the back of an official blank ballot, prepared in 28 29 accordance with law, and at such place on the back of the ballot that the initials may be seen after the ballot has been marked and 30 folded, and when so indorsed he shall deliver it to the voter, 31 32 which ballot the voter shall mark in the manner provided by law, which when done the voter shall deliver the same to the initialing 33 manager or, in his absence, to the alternate initialing manager, 34 in the presence of the others, and the manager shall see that the 35 ballot so delivered bears on the back thereof the genuine initials 36 of the initialing manager, or alternate initialing manager, and if 37 so, but not otherwise, the ballot shall be put into the ballot 38 box; and when so done one (1) of the managers or a duly appointed 39 40 clerk shall make the proper entry on the pollbook. If the voter is unable to write his name on the receipt book, a manager or 41 clerk shall note on the back of the ballot that it was receipted 42 for by his assistance. 43

No state court shall have the authority to extend the hours that the polls shall be open. Upon 50 the opening of the polls, and not before, the managers of the 51 52 election shall designate two (2) of their number, other than the manager theretofore designated to receive the blank ballots, who 53 54 shall thereupon be known respectively as the initialing manager and the alternate initialing manager. The alternate initialing 55 manager, in the absence of the initialing manager, shall perform 56 57 all of the duties and undertake all of the responsibilities of the initialing manager. When any person entitled to vote shall appear 58 59 to vote, the managers shall identify the voter, in the presence and view of the bystanders, by requiring the voter to submit a 60

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valid Mississippi driver's license, identification card issued by 61 the Department of Public Safety, voter registration card, Medicaid 62 or Medicare card, health insurance card, tax receipt or other 63 64 identification card or by comparison with the descriptive 65 information on the pollbook or have a person from the precinct vouch for such person's identification; and then such person shall 66 sign his name in a receipt book or booklet provided for that 67 purpose and to be used at that election only and said receipt book 68 or booklet shall be used in lieu of the list of voters who have 69 voted formerly made by the managers or clerks; whereupon and not 70 71 before, the initialing manager or, in his absence, the alternate initialing manager shall indorse his initials on the back of an 72 73 official blank ballot, prepared in accordance with law, and at such place on the back of the ballot that the initials may be seen 74 after the ballot has been marked and folded, and when so indorsed 75 he shall deliver it to the voter, which ballot the voter shall 76 mark in the manner provided by law, which when done the voter 77 78 shall deliver the same to the initialing manager or, in his absence, to the alternate initialing manager, in the presence of 79 80 the others, and the manager shall see that the ballot so delivered bears on the back thereof the genuine initials of the initialing 81 82 manager, or alternate initialing manager, and if so, but not otherwise, the ballot shall be put into the ballot box; and when 83 so done one (1) of the managers or a duly appointed clerk shall 84 make the proper entry on the pollbook. If the voter is unable to 85 write his name on the receipt book, a manager or clerk shall note 86 87 on the back of the ballot that it was receipted for by his assistance. 88

89 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 90 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 91 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 92 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 93 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the

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96 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 97 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 98 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
