HOUSE BILL NO. 264 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-6-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ESTABLISH MEETING ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERS OF LOCAL 3 SCHOOL BOARDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-6-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

37-6-13. (1) Each person serving as a member of the school 7 board of any school district shall receive per diem in the amount 8 of Sixty-seven Dollars (\$67.00) for no more than thirty-six (36) 9 meetings of the school board during any one (1) fiscal year or, in 10 his or her discretion, irrevocably may choose to receive as 11 compensation for his or her services an annual salary in the 12 amount of Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00), which 13 choice shall remain in force for all successive terms or periods 14 of service of that member. The receipt of the compensation shall 15 not entitle any member of a school board to receive or be eligible 16 for any state employee group insurance, retirement or other fringe 17 benefits. Each member shall be reimbursed for the necessary 18 expenses and mileage in attending meetings of the school board. 19 In addition to the foregoing, all members may be reimbursed for 20 21 mileage and actual expenses incurred in the further performance of 22 their duties, including attendance at any mandatory school board training session or at regional and national education meetings, 23 when such mileage and other expenses are authorized by the board 24 prior to the date on which they occur. Detailed vouchers shall be 25 26 submitted for reimbursement for all expenses authorized by this

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27 section. Such reimbursement shall be in accordance with Section 28 25-3-41.

29 Such expenses shall be paid on order of the school board by 30 pay certificates issued by the superintendent of the school 31 district involved against the funds available for payment of the 32 administrative expense of the district.

(2) (a) If a member of a school board misses twenty percent 33 (20%) or more of the meetings of the school board during a 34 calendar year, except for absences caused by required military 35 duty, the member must reimburse the school district that portion 36 37 of the total salary paid to the member that year which is proportionate to the number of meetings missed by the member in 38 relation to the total number of school board meetings held during 39 40 that year. For purposes of this subsection, consideration may be given only to meetings of which public notice is required. 41 Before February 1 of each year, the president of 42 (b)

44 <u>of Education containing the names of any members of the school</u>
45 <u>board who missed twenty percent (20%) or more of the school board</u>
46 <u>meetings during the preceding calendar year.</u>

47 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 48 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 49 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 50 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 51 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 52 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 53 extended.

54 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after January 1, 2003, if it is effectuated on or before that 56 date under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended 57 and extended. If it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 58 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after January 1, 59 2003, this act shall take effect and be in force from and after
