HOUSE BILL NO. 320

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-6-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 2 3 STANDARDS AND TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 45-6-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 45-6-5. (1) There is hereby created the Board on Law 7 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training, which shall consist of 8 twelve (12) members. 9 The Governor shall appoint five (5) members of the board 10 (2) from the following specified categories: 11 (a) Two (2) members, each to be a chief of police of a 12 13 municipality in this state, with one (1) of such municipalities having a population of less than one thousand two hundred (1,200) 14 according to the latest federal decennial census. 15 (b) One (1) member shall be a sheriff in this state. 16 One (1) member shall be a district attorney in this (C) 17 18 state. One (1) member shall be a representative of higher 19 (d) 20 education. 21 The initial appointments to the board shall be made by the Governor no later than twenty (20) days after the effective date 22 of this chapter, as follows: the chief of police and the 23 representative of higher education each shall be appointed for a 24 term of two (2) years; and the sheriff and the district attorney 25 26 each shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years. Upon the 27 expiration of the terms of the initial appointees to the board,

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each subsequent appointment shall be made for a term of three (3) 28 29 years, beginning on the date of the expiration of the previous 30 term. A vacancy in any appointed position on the board prior to the expiration of a term shall be filled by appointment of the 31 32 Governor only for the balance of the unexpired term. 33 (3) The remaining seven (7) members of the board shall be the following: 34 The Attorney General. 35 (a) The Director of the Mississippi Highway Safety 36 (b) 37 Patrol. (C) The President of the Mississippi Municipal 38 Association or his designee. 39 The President of the Mississippi Association of 40 (d) Supervisors or his designee. 41 The President of the Mississippi Constable 42 (e) Association or his designee. 43 The President of the Mississippi Campus Law 44 (f) 45 Enforcement Officers Association or his designee. (g) The President of the Mississippi Fraternal Order of 46 47 Police or his designee. The Attorney General, the Director of the Mississippi Highway 48 49 Safety Patrol and the respective presidents of the foregoing associations shall serve only for their respective terms of 50 office. 51 52 (4)Members of the board shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for any actual and 53 54 reasonable expenses incurred as a necessary incident to such service, including mileage, as provided in Section 25-3-41. 55 There shall be a chairman and a vice chairman of the 56 (5) 57 board, elected by and from the membership of the board. The board 58 shall adopt rules and regulations governing times and places for 59 meetings and governing the manner of conducting its business, but the board shall meet at least every three (3) months. 60

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62 <u>(6)</u> The board shall report annually to the Governor and the 63 Legislature on its activities, and may make such other reports as 64 it deems desirable.

65 <u>(7)</u> The training officers of all police academies in the 66 state whose curricula are approved by the board shall be advisors 67 to the board. They shall be entitled to all privileges of the 68 board members, including travel expenses and subsistence, but 69 shall not be eligible to vote at board meetings.

70 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 71 and after July 1, 2002.
