HOUSE BILL NO. 345

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT ANY AGENCY, BOARD, COMMISSION, DEPARTMENT, OR INSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FROM PURCHASING NEW 3 EQUIPMENT, HIRING NEW EMPLOYEES, OR PROMOTING, RECLASSIFYING, REALLOCATING OR REALIGNING PAY GRADES WITH REGARD TO ANY OF ITS EMPLOYEES OR JOB POSITIONS, DURING THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; TO 6 ESTABLISH AN APPEAL PROCEDURE TO THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER FOR EMERGENCY PURCHASES OF EQUIPMENT OR HIRING OF NEW EMPLOYEES; TO 7 SET FORTH THE DEMONSTRATION OF THE EMERGENCY THAT MUST BE MADE BY 8 THE AGENCY IN ITS APPEAL; TO PROVIDE THAT THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMITTEE SHALL BE NOTIFIED OF SUCH AN APPEAL AND THAT 9 10 11 COMMITTEE MEMBERS MAY ATTEND THE HEARING ON SUCH AN APPEAL; TO ALLOW THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER, IN HIS DISCRETION, TO AUTHORIZE THE ACTION SOUGHT IN THE APPEAL; TO AMEND SECTION 25-9-116, 12 13 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; TO BRING FORWARD 14 SECTIONS 27-104-13 AND 31-17-123, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR 15 PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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- **SECTION 1.** (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 18
- (2), until June 30, 2002, due to the severe revenue shortfall 19
- during the current fiscal year, the following provisions shall 20
- 21 apply:
- No state agency is authorized to purchase any 22 (a)
- 23 equipment as defined in Section 31-7-1.
- (b) No state agency is authorized to hire any new 24
- 25 employees, or promote, reclassify, reallocate or realign a pay
- grade with regard to any of its employees or job positions. The 26
- State Personnel Board shall immediately suspend all hirings, 27
- promotions, reclassifications, reallocations and pay grade 28
- realignments of employees or job positions in accordance with 29
- Section 25-9-116. 30
- (2) If a state agency determines that it is necessary to 31
- 32 purchase any equipment or hire any new employees before July 1,
- 2002, the agency may appeal to the State Fiscal Officer. 33
- State Fiscal Officer shall immediately notify the Joint 34

- 35 Legislative Budget Committee of the state agency's appeal and the
- 36 date upon which the State Fiscal Officer will hold a hearing on
- 37 the appeal. The State Fiscal Officer shall grant a hearing to the
- 38 state agency on its appeal within fifteen (15) days after notice
- 39 of the appeal is given to the State Fiscal Officer. The hearing
- 40 shall not be a public meeting; however, any member of the Joint
- 41 Legislative Budget Committee may attend the hearing. At the
- 42 hearing, the state agency must demonstrate to the satisfaction of
- 43 the State Fiscal Officer that a serious emergency exists of such
- 44 magnitude that the essential mission of the agency cannot be
- 45 carried out without the immediate purchase of the equipment or the
- 46 hiring of the new employees. If the state agency makes the
- 47 demonstration required by this subsection, the State Fiscal
- 48 Officer, in his discretion, may authorize the agency to purchase
- 49 some or all of the equipment or hire some or all of the new
- 50 employees requested by the agency.
- 51 (3) The provisions of this section apply to every state
- 52 agency, including state agencies that do not receive or expend any
- 53 monies from the State General Fund.
- 54 (4) For purposes of this section, the term "state agency"
- 55 means any agency, board, commission, department or institution of
- 56 the State of Mississippi.
- 57 **SECTION 2.** Section 25-9-116, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 58 amended as follows:
- [Through June 30, 2002, this section will read as follows:]
- 60 25-9-116. * * * The State Personnel Board shall institute an
- 61 immediate suspension of all hirings, promotions,
- 62 reclassifications, reallocations and pay grade realignments * * *.
- [From and after July 1, 2002, this section will read as
- 64 follows:]
- 65 25-9-116. Upon recommendation of the State Fiscal Officer,
- 66 after a determination that the state revenue and expenditure
- 67 requires such action the State Personnel Board may institute an

- 68 immediate suspension of all hirings, promotions,
- 69 reclassifications, reallocations and pay grade realignments until
- $\,$ 70 $\,$ such time as the State Fiscal $\,$ Officer $\,$ shall recommend that such
- 71 action is no longer required.
- 72 SECTION 3. Section 27-104-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 73 brought forward as follows:
- 74 27-104-13. The State Fiscal Officer shall have the right to
- 75 disapprove or reduce and revise such estimates of general funds
- 76 and state-source special funds for any General Fund or special
- 77 fund agency, and for the "administration and other expenses"
- 78 budget of the State Highway Department, in an amount not to exceed
- 79 five percent (5%) if he finds that funds will not be available
- 80 within the period for which the budget is drawn, or if he finds
- 81 that the requested expenditures, or any part thereof, are not
- 82 authorized by law, and such action shall be reported to the
- 83 Legislative Budget Office. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his
- 84 determination of need based upon a finding that funds will not be
- 85 available within the period for which the budget is drawn,
- 86 transfer funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working
- 87 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement
- 88 the General Fund revenue. In the event that the estimates of
- 89 general funds and state-source special funds of all General Fund
- 90 and special fund agencies, and of the "administration and other
- 91 expenses" budget of the State Highway Department, have been
- 92 reduced by five percent (5%), additional reductions may be made
- 93 but shall consist of a uniform percentage reduction of general
- 94 funds and state-source special funds to all General Fund and
- 95 special fund agencies, and to the "administration and other
- 96 expenses" budget of the State Highway Department. Any
- 97 state-source special funds reduced under the provisions of this
- 98 section shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon
- 99 requisitions for warrants signed by the respective agency head and

said transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined by the State Fiscal Officer.

For the purpose of this section, "state-source special funds" 102 103 shall be construed to mean any special funds in any agency derived 104 from any source, but shall not include the following special 105 funds: special funds derived from federal sources, from local or regional political subdivisions, or from donations; special funds 106 held in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of specific persons 107 or classes of persons; self-generated special funds of the State 108 Institutions of Higher Learning or the state junior colleges; 109 110 special funds of Mississippi Industries for the Blind, the State Port at Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, Pat Harrison Waterway 111 112 District, Pearl River Basin Development District, Pearl River Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee River Valley Water 113 Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed Authority, or Coast 114 Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife, 115 Fisheries and Parks derived from the issuance of hunting or 116 117 fishing licenses; and special funds generated by agencies whose primary function includes the establishment of standards and the 118 119 issuance of licenses for the practice of a profession within the 120 State of Mississippi.

SECTION 4. Section 31-17-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is brought forward as follows:

The intent of the Legislature is to authorize 123 31-17-123. 124 borrowing funds under the provisions of Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 to offset any temporary cash flow deficiencies and 125 should not be construed to authorize the borrowing of any funds in 126 an amount which cannot be repaid during the fiscal year in which 127 such funds are borrowed. The State Tax Commission and University 128 Research Center, utilizing all available revenue forecast data, 129 130 shall annually develop a General Fund revenue estimate to be 131 adopted by the Legislative Budget Office as of the date of sine If, at the end of October, or at the end of any 132 die adjournment.

133	month thereafter of any fiscal year, the revenues received for the
134	fiscal year shall fall below ninety-eight percent (98%) of the
135	Legislative Budget Office General Fund revenue estimate at the
136	date of sine die adjournment, the State Fiscal Officer shall
137	reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds
138	to General Fund and special fund agencies and to the
139	"administration and other expenses" budget of the State Highway
140	Department in an amount necessary to keep expenditures within the
141	sum of actual General Fund receipts including any transfers to the
142	General Fund from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund for
143	the fiscal year. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his
144	determination of need based on the revenue shortfall, transfer
145	funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working
146	Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement
147	the General Fund revenue. State-source special funds in an amount
148	equal to any reduction made under the provisions of this section
149	shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions
150	for warrants signed by the respective agency head and such
151	transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined
152	by the State Fiscal Officer. No agency's allocation shall be
153	reduced in an amount to exceed five percent (5%); however, in the
154	event that the allocations of general funds and state-source
155	special funds to all General Fund and special fund agencies and to
156	the "administration and other expenses" budget of the State
157	Highway Department have been reduced by five percent (5%), any
158	additional reductions required to be made hereunder shall consist
159	of a uniform percentage reduction of general funds and
160	state-source special funds to all General Fund and special fund
161	agencies, and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of
162	the State Highway Department. Any receipt from loans authorized
163	by Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 shall not be included as
164	revenue receipts. The State Fiscal Officer shall immediately send

notice of any action taken under authority of this section to the Legislative Budget Office.
