#### HOUSE BILL NO. 359

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE THE PAYMENT OF AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT AND ONE TIME 2 PROCESS REIMBURSEMENT TO SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS ACQUIRING THE 3 4 NATIONALLY CERTIFIED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST DESIGNATION; AND FOR 5 RELATED PURPOSES BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 37-19-7. (1) \* \* \* The allowance in the \* \* \* Mississippi 9 Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county 10 and separate school district shall be determined and paid in 11 accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in 12 this subsection. For each one percent (1%) that the Sine Die General Fund Revenue Estimate Growth exceeds five percent (5%) for fiscal year 2003, as certified by the Legislative Budget Office to the State Board of Education and subject to specific appropriation therefor by the Legislature, the State Board of Education shall revise the salary scale to provide an additional one percent (1%) across the board increase in the base salaries for each type of license.

102 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 103 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 104 105 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 106 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 107 108 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 109 establish, administer and maintain the system.

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a 110 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 111 112 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any 113 114 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 115 116 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health 117 year. and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the 118 119 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement. 120

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Ten Dollars (\$610.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$465.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

(2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
(\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

(i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education
as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall
submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the
certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be

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eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.

(ii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the 230 requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor 231 (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors 232 and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 233 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. 234 Such 235 licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the endorsement was received prior to 236 October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement 237 in the current school year, or the licensed school counselor shall 238 submit such documentation to the State Department of Education 239 prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 240 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 241 242 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 243 244 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification process for a Master Teacher certificate for school counselors, 245 246 and any school counselor receiving the salary supplement will be 247 required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such 248 249 salary supplement.

250 Any licensed speech-language pathologist and (iii) 251 audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a 252 Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local 253 254 school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of 255 256 Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior 257 to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary

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supplement in the current school year, or the licensed 258 259 speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 260 261 February 15 in order to be eliqible for a prorated salary 262 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 263 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 264 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 265 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school 266 speech-language pathologists and audiologists, and any school 267 268 speech-language pathologist and audiologist receiving the salary supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher 269 270 certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such salary supplement. 271

272 (iv) From and after July 1, 2002, any licensed school psychologist who has met the requirements and acquired the 273 designation "Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP)" 274 275 through the National School Psychology Certification System and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 276 277 Education as a psychologist and not as an administrator. A nationally certified school psychologist must submit documentation 278 to the State Department of Education that the certification was 279 280 received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the nationally 281 282 certified school psychologist must submit such documentation to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order to 283 284 be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. However, the salary supplement 285 authorized under this item will be discontinued two (2) years 286 after the date on which the National Board for Professional 287 Teaching Standards offers a certification process for a Master 288 Teacher certificate for school psychologists, and any school 289 290 psychologist receiving the salary supplement will be required to H. 294 (b) An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for 295 the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for 296 postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) 297 for a school counselor, speech-language pathologist and 298 299 audiologist or school psychologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or 300 301 endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the 302 certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district 303 304 described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school district for such cost, 305 regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of 306 the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity 307 308 has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school 309 district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity 310 for such cost on behalf of the employee. 311

312 (C) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 313 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 314 315 district and shall be in addition to its adequate education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with 316 317 regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school 318 districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 319 320 employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall 321 receive any local supplement to which employees with similar 322 training and experience otherwise are entitled.

No. 359 02/HR40/R856 PAGE 10 (RM\BD) The State Department of Education may not pay any 323 (d) process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who 324 does not complete the certification or endorsement process 325 326 required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an 327 employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to 328 complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee 329 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for 330 all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on 331 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or 332 333 endorsement.

334 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 335 and after July 1, 2002.
