## HOUSE BILL NO. 436

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-62, 1 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS 2 3 MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH 4 THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE SHILOH CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR MONUMENT TRUST 5 FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 6 EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THOSE SECTIONS CREATING THE 7 MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBING ITS POWERS 8 AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISHING THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE 9 SHILOH CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL 10 11 OF HONOR MONUMENT TRUST FUND FROM JULY 1, 2002, TO JULY 1, 2003; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 16 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 17 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 18 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 19 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument 20 should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 21 recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 22 Mississippi veterans. 23

24 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 25 reenacted as follows:

55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven (7) members:

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The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 33 (a) 34 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; 35 36 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans 37 Affairs Board; The Director of the Division of General Services in 38 (C) the Department of Finance and Administration; 39 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one 40 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as 41 42 follows: 43 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II; (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and 44 One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; 45 (iii) (e) One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 46 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 47 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called (2) 48 and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 49 50 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission shall 51 52 elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings of 53 54 the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along with 55 all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall 56 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All actions 57 taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be 58 59 by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the chairman and 60 secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, shall be binding 61 upon the commission. 62

(3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans
Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the
amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion

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thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 66 67 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 68 69 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 70 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as 71 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel 72 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 73 than twelve (12) meetings per year. 74

(4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
Veterans Memorial Commission.

(5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

82 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after 83 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi 84 85 veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so 86 87 that such commission can provide for the design, construction and dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated 88 89 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission.

90 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 91 reenacted as follows:

92 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 93 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and 94 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans 95 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in 96 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

97 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
98 reenacted as follows:

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55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission 99 100 shall:

Plan and provide for the design, construction and 101 (a) 102 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual 103 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the 104 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

105 Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into (b) 106 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

107 (C) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report 108 109 required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each 110 111 year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate. 112

SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 113 reenacted as follows: 114

55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 115 116 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 117 118 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans 119 120 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited 121 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the 122 123 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five 124 125 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the 126 designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans 127 128 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for 129 purposes of this section. Any monies remaining unexpended or 130 unencumbered in the fund upon completion of the monument shall

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131 revert to the Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for 132 maintenance of the veterans monument and memorials.

133 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
134 reenacted as follows:

135 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 136 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission 137 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 138 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 139 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and 140 141 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 142 143 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 144 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and 145 certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 146 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate 147 148 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 149 150 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty 151 152 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission 153 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds 154 155 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument. 156

157 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 158 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 159 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 160 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh 161 Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.

162 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 163 reenacted as follows:

(1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 165 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 166 167 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and 168 provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument 169 recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of In planning the design, construction and dedication of the 170 Honor. monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the 171 State Veterans Affairs Board. 172 The commission may solicit private monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor 173 174 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. 175 The 176 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. 177 A11 funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for 178 179 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 180 monument.

181 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 182 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 183 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 184 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 185 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

186 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 187 amended as follows:

188 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-62, Mississippi 189 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans 190 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, <u>2003</u>.

191 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 192 and after July 1, 2002.
