HOUSE BILL NO. 481

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-26-103, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO EXTEND THE REPEALER ON THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES THE 3 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO IDENTIFY POTENTIALLY NONVIABLE COMMUNITY 4 PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS AND PROVIDE NO COST TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO 5 THOSE SYSTEMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 41-26-103, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

The department shall develop annually a list 9 41-26-103. (1) of community public water systems that the department, after 10 consultation with the Public Utilities Staff created in Section 11 77-2-1, considers to be potentially nonviable or experiencing 12 other problems that may make the system potentially nonviable. 13 14 The list shall state the areas of concern and shall be prioritized based upon viability considerations. The department shall notify 15 at a minimum those systems shown in top ten (10) places on the 16 list and shall offer to provide each of those systems with 17 technical assistance pertaining to the areas of concern for the 18 system at no cost to the system. If the notified community public 19 water system refuses the offer of technical assistance at no cost 20 to the system or fails to respond within sixty (60) days of the 21 22 written offer, the department shall notify the Public Utilities 23 Staff in writing.

(2) Following receipt of notification from the department
that a community public water system has refused to accept
technical assistance or failed to respond, the Public Utilities
Staff may conduct a financial or managerial review, or both, of
the system and shall submit a copy of any report to the

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29 department. The Public Utilities Staff may assess and collect the 30 cost of any financial or management review, or both, from the 31 community public water system on which the review or reviews are 32 conducted.

33 (3) This section shall be repealed on July 1, <u>2003</u>.
34 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
35 and after July 1, 2002.
