HOUSE BILL NO. 494 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTION 37-7-339, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH AUTHORIZES LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE EXTENDED DAY 3 AND EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR PROGRAMS AND TO ADOPT POLICIES, WITH REGARD TO INSTRUCTION, FOR WHICH THERE IS NO SPECIFIC GENERAL LAW OR AGENCY REGULATION; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 37-7-339, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE THE REPEALER ON THAT SECTION; 6 TO AUTHORIZE SCHOOL BOARDS TO EXPEND FUNDS FROM ANY AVAILABLE 7 SOURCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE COSTS OF STUDENT FIELD TRIPS TO PUBLIC OR PRIVATE NONPROFIT MUSEUMS; TO AUTHORIZE SCHOOL 8 9 BOARDS TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR TRAINING OR PROFESSIONAL 10 DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES, OR BOTH, FOR DISTRICT EMPLOYEES; TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE 11 12 MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION SHALL CONDUCT THE CONTINUING 13 EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS, AND TO REQUIRE AN 14 ANNUAL REPORT TO BE PREPARED FOR THE LEGISLATURE DESCRIBING THE 15 TRAINING ACTIVITIES AND INCLUDING AN EVALUATION OF THE TRAINING 16 PROGRAM; TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-306, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION SHALL 17 18 PROVIDE THE CONTINUING TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS; 19 20 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-7-339, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 23 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 37-7-339. (1) The school board of any local school
- 25 district, in its discretion, may provide extended day and extended
- 26 school year programs for kindergarten or compulsory-school-age
- 27 students, or both, and may expend any funds for these purposes
- 28 which are available from * * * sources other than the adequate
- 29 <u>education program</u>. It is not the intent of the Legislature, in
- 30 enacting this section, to interfere with the Headstart program.
- 31 School boards, in their discretion, may charge participants a
- 32 reasonable fee for such programs.
- 33 (2) The school board of any school district may adopt any
- 34 orders, policies, rules or regulations with respect to instruction
- 35 within that school district for which no specific provision has
- 36 been made by general law and which are not inconsistent with the

- 37 Mississippi Constitution of 1890, the Mississippi Code of 1972, or
- 38 any order, policy, rule or regulation of the State Board of
- 39 Education; those school boards also may alter, modify and repeal
- 40 any orders, policies, rules or regulations enacted under this
- 41 subsection. Any such program pertaining to reading must further
- 42 the goal that Mississippi students will demonstrate a growing
- 43 proficiency in reading and will reach or exceed the national
- 44 average within the next decade.

- 46 **SECTION 2.** The school board of a local school district may
- 47 expend funds from any available sources for the purpose of
- 48 defraying the cost of student field trips to public or private
- 49 nonprofit museums, including the cost of admission to such
- 50 museums.
- 51 **SECTION 3.** The school board of a local school district may
- 52 enter into contracts or agreements with persons or entities,
- 53 public or private, to provide training or professional development
- 54 activities, or both, for employees of the district.
- SECTION 4. Section 37-3-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 56 amended as follows:
- 57 37-3-4. (1) There is established * * * within the State
- 58 Department of Education, the School Executive Management
- 59 Institute. The director shall be appointed by the State Board of
- 60 Education upon recommendation by the State Superintendent of
- 61 Public Education. The State Superintendent of Public Education,
- 62 with the approval of the State Board of Education, shall assign
- 63 sufficient staff members from the State Department of Education to
- 64 the institute.
- 65 (2) It shall be the purpose and duty of the institute to
- 66 conduct thorough empirical studies and analyses of the school
- 67 management needs of the local school districts throughout the
- 68 state, to make recommendations to the State Board of Education
- 69 regarding standards and programs of training that aid in the

70 development of administrative and management skills of local

71 school administrators, and to conduct such programs related to

these purposes as they are implemented under guidelines

73 established by the State Board of Education.

74 (3) The State Board of Education shall develop and implement

75 through the School Executive Management Institute a program for

76 the development of administrative and management skills of local

77 school administrators under which all local school administrators

78 shall be required to participate. Subject to the extent of

79 appropriations available for such purpose, the School Executive

Management Institute or the Mississippi School Boards Association

shall be required to offer courses at least twice a year on the

82 uses of technology to principals, superintendents and other

administrative personnel. These courses shall relate to the

application of technology to learning, as well as administrative

85 problems.

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86 (4) (a) The institute shall have an advisory board composed

of ten (10) qualified members appointed by the State Board of

88 Education after consultation with the State Superintendent of

89 Public Education. This advisory board will offer recommendations

90 to the institute on the types of training to be instituted and

91 supported. The membership of the advisory board shall be composed

92 of the following members, two (2) to be appointed from each

93 congressional district: three (3) school administrators; one (1)

94 representative of public community/junior colleges within the

95 state; one (1) representative of a school of education in an

96 institution of higher learning within the state; two (2) local

97 school board members; one (1) classroom teacher; and two (2) lay

98 persons. In making the initial appointments, three (3) members

99 shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, three (3) members

100 shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, two (2) members

101 shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years, and two (2)

102 members shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years.

Thereafter, all members shall be appointed for a term of four (4) 103 The advisory board shall meet when called by the director, 104 but in no event fewer than three (3) times per year. The members 105 106 of the advisory board shall be compensated at the per diem rate 107 authorized by Section 25-3-69 and reimbursed for actual and

108 necessary expenses as authorized by Section 25-3-41.

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(b) Board members of the Oxford-Lafayette Business and Industrial Complex shall be paid per diem and reimbursed for expenses and mileage from local funds in accordance with Section 37-6-13.

(5) (a) Basic Education Course. Subject to the extent of appropriations available for such purpose, the School Executive Management Institute of the State Department of Education shall prepare and conduct a course of training for basic education for the local school board members of this state, in order for board members to carry out their duties more effectively and be exposed to new ideas involving school restructuring. The basic course shall be known as the "School Board Member Training Course" and shall consist of at least twelve (12) hours of training. School Executive Management Institute shall issue certificates of completion to those school board members who complete the basic education course.

(b) Continuing Education Course. The Mississippi School Boards Association shall be responsible for preparing and 126 127 conducting a course of training for continuing education for the local school board members of this state, in order for board 128 members to carry out their duties more effectively and be exposed 129 to new ideas involving school restructuring. The continuing 130 education course shall be known as the "Continuing Education 131 Course for School Board Members" and shall consist of at least six 132 (6) hours of training. * * * 133

137 expenses for preparing and conducting the continuing education course provided for in this paragraph shall be paid out of any 138 139 funds which are made available to the Mississippi School Boards 140 Association upon authorization and appropriation by the Legislature to the State Department of Education. * * * 141 The Mississippi School Boards Association shall prepare 142 (6) and submit a report each year to the State Board of Education and 143 to the respective Chairs of the House and Senate Education 144 Committees describing the activities and providing an evaluation 145 146 of the continuing education programs offered by the association 147 each year. (7) The School Executive Management Institute of the State 148 Department of Education, or the Mississippi School Boards 149 Association with the oversight of the State Board of Education, at 150 151 least twice a year, shall prepare and conduct required courses of training for continuing education for the elementary and secondary 152 153 school principals of this state, in order for principals to carry out their duties more effectively and be exposed to new ideas 154 155 involving school management. The continuing education course shall be known as the "Continuing Education Course for Principals" 156 157 and shall consist of at least six (6) hours of training. 158 content of the continuing education courses and the time and place such courses are to be conducted shall be determined by the School 159 160 Executive Management Institute or the Mississippi School Boards Association; however, to the extent practicable, such training 161 162 sessions shall be held within geographical proximity of local districts in order that travel times and costs shall not be 163 prohibitive. * * * 164 The institute shall issue certificates of completion to those 165 166 principals who complete such courses. All costs and expenses for 167 preparing and conducting the basic and continuing education 168 courses provided for in this subsection shall be paid out of any

complete the * * * continuing education course. All costs and

- funds which are made available to the institute upon authorization 169 170 and appropriation by the Legislature.
- In the event any school district meets Level 4 or 5 171 172 accreditation requirements, the State Board of Education, in its 173 discretion, may exempt the school superintendents, principals and other administrators of such school district from the provisions 174
- 175 of this section.
- SECTION 5. Section 37-7-306, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 176 amended as follows: 177
- 37-7-306. (1) Every school board member selected after July 178
- 179 1, 2002, shall have a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- Every school board member selected after July 1, 1993, 180
- shall be required to complete a basic course of training and 181
- education for local school board members, in order for board 182
- members to carry out their duties more effectively and be exposed 183
- to new ideas involving school restructuring. Such basic course of 184
- training, approved by the State Board of Education, shall be 185
- 186 conducted by the School Executive Management Institute of the
- State Department of Education. Upon completion of the basic 187
- 188 course of training, the School Executive Management Institute
- shall file a certificate of completion for the school board member 189
- with the office of the local school board. 190 In the event that a
- board member fails to complete such training within six (6) months 191
- of his selection, * * * such board member shall no longer be 192
- 193 qualified to serve and shall be removed from office.
- In addition to meeting the requirements of subsection 194
- (2) of this section, after taking office, each school board member 195
- shall be required to file annually in the office of the school 196
- board a certificate of completion of a course of continuing 197
- 198 education conducted by the Mississippi School Boards
- Association. * * * 199

- 200 (4) Every school board member selected after July 1, 2002, 201 shall spend at least one (1) full day in a school in the district 202 they represent, without compensation.
- Upon the failure of any local school board member to 203 204 file with the school board the certificate of completion of the basic or continuing course of training as provided in subsection 205 206 (2) or (3) of this section, the school board member shall be removed from office by the Attorney General. In the event of a 207 medical or other catastrophic hardship that prevents such school 208 board member from obtaining the required training or filing such 209 certificate, as may be defined by the State Board of Education by 210 rule and regulation, an additional period of three (3) months may 211 be allowed to satisfy the requirements of subsection (2) or (3). 212 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from 213

and after July 1, 2002.
