HOUSE BILL NO. 569

- AN ACT TO REENACT SECTION 49-37-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDES THAT IF THE MISSISSIPPI SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION
 MANAGEMENT SYSTEM COORDINATING COUNCIL IS FUNDED, THE COUNCIL
 SHALL DEVELOP AND PREPARE A STRATEGIC PLAN FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A STATEWIDE SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION MANAGEMENT
 SYSTEM; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 49-37-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE REPEALER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-37-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 11 49-37-9. (1) Only in the event that the Mississippi
- 12 Scientific Information Management System Coordinating Council is
- 13 funded pursuant to appropriation by the Mississippi State
- 14 Legislature, the council shall develop and prepare a strategic
- 15 plan for the development and implementation of a statewide
- 16 scientific information management system. In the event that the
- 17 Mississippi State Legislature does not appropriate funds for the
- 18 support of the council for fiscal year 2002, any contracts or
- 19 instruments executed in connection with such a strategic plan
- 20 shall be invalid to the extent that there is no funding for the
- 21 effectuation of such contracts or instruments.
- 22 (2) If a strategic plan is developed in accordance with
- 23 subsection (1), it shall include, but not be limited to, the
- 24 following:
- 25 (a) A detailed analysis of the sources, types, amounts
- 26 and methods by which scientific information is currently collected
- 27 in the state and of methods or systems currently used to manage
- 28 that scientific information;

- 32 costs to state agencies;
- 33 (c) A description of current efforts by agencies and
- 34 organizations collecting scientific information to provide broad
- 35 access to that information;
- 36 (d) An identification of planned scientific information
- 37 management programs and needs and an evaluation of how those
- 38 planned programs or needs may be met or integrated into the
- 39 statewide scientific information management system;
- 40 (e) A clearly-defined, comprehensive statement of the
- 41 mission, goals and objectives of the statewide scientific
- 42 information management system;
- 43 (f) A detailed analysis of the benefits and
- 44 capabilities of a statewide scientific information management
- 45 system;
- 46 (q) A plan for the development and implementation of a
- 47 statewide scientific information management system in a phased
- 48 manner;
- 49 (h) A timeline for the development and implementation
- of a statewide scientific information management system;
- 51 (i) A detailed analysis and estimate of the costs for
- 52 development and implementation of the statewide scientific
- 53 information management system and a recommended method for funding
- 54 the development and implementation of the system;
- (j) A recommendation of appropriate policies and
- 56 standards for use in management of scientific information and for
- 57 providing access to that information;
- 58 (k) An analysis of information accuracy and quality
- 59 issues, ease of access issues, training and technical support
- 60 issues and interagency coordination issues; and



(1) Any other information the coordinating coun

- 63 (3) If a strategic plan is developed in accordance with
- 64 subsection (1), upon its completion, the coordinating council
- 65 shall provide copies to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the
- 66 Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chairmen of the
- 67 Senate Environmental Protection, Conservation and Water Resources
- 68 Committee and the Senate Appropriations Committee, the Chairmen of
- 69 the House Conservation and Water Resources Committee and the House
- 70 Appropriations Committee, the Legislative Budget Office, the
- 71 Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review Committee and the
- 72 Legislative Reference Bureau.
- 73 (4) The provisions of this section shall be repealed from
- 74 and after July 1, 2003.
- 75 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 76 and after July 1, 2002.
