## HOUSE BILL NO. 605

- AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 9-9-18, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH AN ADDITIONAL COUNTY COURT JUDGE FOR RANKIN COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 6 9-9-18, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 7 9-9-18. (1) In order to relieve the crowded condition of
- 8 the docket in the county court and in the youth court of Rankin
- 9 County and particularly to facilitate and make possible the trial
- 10 and disposition of the large number of causes on said docket and
- in the youth court, there shall be two (2) county judges for
- 12 Rankin County, Mississippi, provided for and elected as herein set
- 13 out.
- 14 (2) For the purposes of nomination and election, the two (2)
- 15 judgeships shall be separate and distinct, the presently existing
- 16 judgeship and its succession to be denominated for purposes of
- 17 appointment, nomination and election only as "Place One" and the
- 18 judgeship hereby created and its succession for said selfsame
- 19 purposes and none other to be designated as "Place Two." There
- 20 shall be no distinction whatsoever in the powers, duties and
- 21 emoluments of the two (2) offices of county judge, except that the
- 22 county judge of Rankin County who has been for the longest time
- 23 continuously a county judge of said county shall have the right to
- 24 assign causes, terms and dockets.
- 25 (3) While there shall be no limitation whatsoever upon the
- 26 powers and duties of the said county judges other than as cast
- 27 upon them by the Constitution and laws of this state, the County

- 28 Court of Rankin County may, in the discretion of the county judge
- 29 who has been for the longest time continuously a judge of said
- 30 court, be divided into civil, equity, criminal and youth court
- 31 divisions as a matter of convenience by the entry of an order upon
- 32 the minutes of the court.
- 33 (4) The two (2) county judges shall be elected a the time
- 34 and in the same manner now prescribed by law for the existing
- 35 county court judgeship of Rankin County.
- 36 (5) The Board of Supervisors of Rankin County may, in its
- 37 discretion, set aside, appropriate and expend monies from the
- 38 general fund to be used in the payment of salaries of judges,
- 39 clerks, reporters, officers and employees of the youth court
- 40 division of the county court, including the related facilities of
- 41 the youth court division of the county court, and such funds shall
- 42 be expended for no other purposes. The county shall not be
- 43 reimbursed for the amount of any such levy provided for by this
- 44 section under the terms of the Homestead Exemption Law.
- 45 **SECTION 2.** The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 46 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 47 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 48 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 49 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 50 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 51 extended.
- 52 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 53 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 54 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
