## HOUSE BILL NO. 619

To: County Affairs

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-3-42, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY TO GRADE, GRAVEL

- OR SHELL, REPAIR AND/OR MAINTAIN PRIVATE GRAVEL OR SHELL ROADS OR DRIVEWAYS TO PRIVATE RESIDENCES IF SUCH ROADS OR DRIVEWAYS ARE USED AS SCHOOL BUS TURNAROUNDS FOR PRIVATE SCHOOLS; AND FOR 3

- RELATED PURPOSES. 6
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 19-3-42, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8
- amended as follows: 9
- 10 19-3-42. (1) The board of supervisors of any county is
- hereby authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to grade, 11
- gravel or shell, repair, and/or maintain private gravel or shell 12
- roads or driveways to private residences if such roads or 13
- driveways are used as school bus turnarounds for public or private 14
- schools. 15
- Prior to engaging in the work authorized in subsection 16
- (1) of this section, the board of supervisors shall spread upon 17
- the official minutes of the board: 18
- The written request of the public school board or 19
- 20 the written request of the governing authority of the private
- school for such work; 21
- The written approval of the board of supervisors 22
- for such work; 23
- 24 The specific location of the road or driveway to be
- worked; and 25
- The name of the owner of the road or driveway to be 26
- 27 worked.
- The written request of the public school board or the 2.8
- written request of the governing authority of the private school, 29

as required in subsection (2)(a) above, shall contain a current 30 list of all active school bus turnarounds presently in use  $\underline{\text{or}}$ 31 contemplated for use by the public school district or by the 32 33 governing authority of the private school for the present school 34 The approval by the board of supervisors shall be valid and effective for the period of time that a turnaround is anticipated 35 for use, but in no event for a period greater than one (1) year. 36 In addition to the authority granted in subsection (1) 37 of this section, from and after October 1, 1989, the board of 38 supervisors of any county is further authorized, in its 39 40 discretion, to maintain public school grounds of the county and to grade, gravel, shell or overlay, and/or to maintain gravel, shell, 41 42 asphalt or concrete roads, driveways or parking lots of public schools of the county if, before engaging in such work, the board 43 of supervisors shall spread upon its official minutes the written 44 request of the school board for such work, the written approval of 45 the board of supervisors for such work and the specific location 46 47 of the school grounds or road, driveway or parking lot, to be worked. 48 49 In addition to any other authority granted in this section, the board of supervisors of any county is hereby 50 51 authorized, in its discretion, to repair and maintain driveways and parking lots of: (a) any nonprofit organization in the county 52 which is tax exempt under Section 501(c) of the United States 53

54 Internal Revenue Code and which has as one (1) of its primary purposes for organization to aid and assist in the rehabilitation 55 56 of persons suffering from drug abuse or drug addiction; and (b) any private, nonprofit cemeteries in the county. The board of 57 supervisors of any county shall not be authorized under the 58 provisions of this subsection to repair or maintain driveways or 59 parking lots located more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from 60 61 the center of any highway, road or street under the jurisdiction 62 of the county.

63 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

64 and after July 1, 2002.
