## HOUSE BILL NO. 642

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-63-3, 37-151-17, 37-151-69 AND
 37-153-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE
 SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION TO DESIGNATE AN APPROPRIATE INDIVIDUAL
 TO SERVE IN HIS PLACE ON CERTAIN STATE BOARDS AND COUNCILS; AND
 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 SECTION 1. Section 37-63-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

8 amended as follows:

37-63-3. The Authority for Educational Television shall 9 consist of the State Superintendent of Public Education, or his 10 designee, and six (6) members appointed, with the advice and 11 consent of the Senate. The Governor shall appoint four (4) 12 members, one (1) of whom shall be actively engaged as a teacher or 13 14 principal in a secondary school system in the State of Mississippi and one (1) of whom shall be actively engaged as a teacher or 15 principal in an elementary school system in the State of 16 Mississippi. Beginning July 1, 1994, the appointee actively 17 engaged as a teacher or principal in a secondary school shall be 18 appointed for an initial term of three (3) years. The member 19 actively engaged as a teacher or principal in an elementary school 20 21 shall be appointed for an initial term of four (4) years. The 22 remaining two (2) gubernatorial appointees shall serve until July 1, 1996. Beginning July 1, 1996, the Governor shall appoint two 23 (2) members for initial terms of three (3) and four (4) years, 24 with the Governor specifically designating which member shall be 25 appointed for three (3) years and which shall be appointed for 26 27 four (4) years. The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall appoint one (1) member, and the Board of Trustees of the 28

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29 State Institutions of Higher Learning shall appoint one (1) 30 member. After the expiration of the initial terms, all members 31 shall serve for terms of four (4) years. An appointment to fill a 32 vacancy among the gubernatorial appointees, other than by 33 expiration of a term of office, shall be made by the Governor for 34 the balance of the unexpired term.

35 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-151-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 36 amended as follows:

37 37-151-17. (1) There is established the Council for
38 Education Technology which shall be an advisory group attached to
39 the State Board of Education. The council shall develop a master
40 plan for education technology.

The council shall consist of the State Superintendent of 41 (2)42 Public Education or his designee, the Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services, the 43 Executive Director of Mississippi Educational Television (ETV), 44 45 the Executive Director of the Mississippi Library Commission, the Executive Director of the State Board for Community and Junior 46 Colleges and the Commissioner of Higher Education, who shall serve 47 as ex officio voting members, and four (4) members appointed 48 within thirty (30) days after July 1, 1994, as follows: 49

50 (a) One (1) member appointed by the State Board of51 Education;

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(b) Two (2) members appointed by the Governor; and

(c) One (1) member appointed by the Executive Director of the <u>Mississippi Development Authority</u>. All appointed members of the council shall have a demonstrated knowledge in an area of technology as defined in Section 37-151-15(2). All appointments to the council shall be made with the advice and consent of the Senate. A majority of the membership present at any meeting shall constitute a quorum for the official conduct of business.

60 (3) Members shall be appointed for four-year terms and may
61 be reappointed. Members may be reimbursed for mileage and actual

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(4) Immediately upon receiving notice of the appointment of
all members, the State Superintendent of <u>Public</u> Education shall
call an organizational meeting. At this meeting the State
Superintendent of <u>Public</u> Education <u>or his designee</u> shall preside
as temporary chairman, and the council shall elect from among the
members a chairman and any other officers it deems necessary, and
define the duties of the officers.

(5) Meetings shall be held at least four (4) times per year, or upon call of the chairman, at a time and place designated by the chairman. The State Department of Education shall provide staff support for the council.

76 (6) The duties and responsibilities of the council shall
77 include, but <u>are</u> not \* \* \* limited to, the following:

Developing a long-range master plan for the 78 (a) 79 efficient and equitable use of technology at all levels from primary school through higher education, including vocational and 80 81 adult education. The plan shall focus on the technology requirements of classroom instruction, literacy laboratories, 82 83 student record management, financial and administrative management, distance learning and communications as they relate to 84 the state's performance goals for students. The plan shall be 85 presented to the Mississippi Department of Information Technology 86 Services for approval; 87

(b) Creating, overseeing and monitoring a well-planned
and efficient statewide network of technology services designed to
meet the educational and informational needs of the schools;

92 development of technology products specifically designed to answer

No. 642 02/HR03/R1040 PAGE 3 (RM\LH) 94 (d) Encouraging an environment receptive to 95 technological progress in education throughout the state; and Working with other state entities to maximize the 96 (e) 97 use and benefit of the state's technology infrastructure, to avoid 98 duplication of public and private resources and to maximize the 99 purchasing ability of the state. When appropriate, shared resources and competitive bidding shall be used. 100 All contracts, requests for proposals and bid awards shall be 101 subject to the approval of the Mississippi Department of 102 103 Information Technology Services. 104 SECTION 3. Section 37-151-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 105 There is created the Mississippi Work Force 106 37-151-69. (1) 107 Development Advisory Council, which shall have the following 108 duties: To provide a forum for developing the necessary 109 (a) collaboration among state agencies at the highest level for 110 111 accomplishing the purposes of this article; To monitor the effectiveness of the career centers 112 (b) 113 and district councils created pursuant to this article; To advise the Governor and public schools, 114 (C)115 community and junior colleges and institutions of higher learning on effective school-to-work transition policies and programs that 116 link students moving from high school to higher education and 117 118 students moving between community colleges and four-year institutions in pursuit of academic and technical skills training; 119 To work with industry to identify barriers that 120 (d) inhibit the delivery of quality work force education and the 121 responsiveness of educational institutions to the needs of 122 industry; and 123 To provide periodic assessments on effectiveness 124 (e) 125 and results of the system of career centers and district councils.

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126 (2) The state council shall be composed of the following127 twenty-seven (27) persons:

A private sector representative from each of the 128 (a) 129 fifteen (15) district councils, who will have initial terms as 130 follows: one (1) year for the representatives of Coahoma 131 Community College District, Itawamba Community College District, Hinds Community College District, Jones Junior College District 132 133 and Southwest Mississippi Community College District; two (2) years for representatives of Northeast Mississippi Community 134 College District, Copiah-Lincoln Community College District, Pearl 135 136 River Community College District, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District and East Mississippi Community College District; 137 and three (3) years for representatives of Northwest Mississippi 138 Community College District, Mississippi Delta Community College 139 140 District, Meridian Community College District, East Central Community College District and Holmes Community College District. 141 All subsequent appointments shall be for a term of three (3) years 142 143 and continue until their successors are appointed and qualify. An appointment to fill a vacancy which arises for reasons other than 144 145 by expiration of a term of office shall be for the unexpired term 146 only;

The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall 245 (4) provide the necessary staff and administrative support to the 246 state council. 247 248 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2002. 249
