29 (k) Other counseling duties or other duties as assigned

(3) The State Department of Education may adopt regulations
 regarding the activities of the school guidance counselors which
 are not inconsistent with this section.

34 (4) School guidance counselors shall abide by the American35 School Counselor Association Code of Ethics.

36 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 37 and after July 1, 2002.
