## HOUSE BILL NO. 701

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 65-39-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE PROJECTS INCLUDED IN THE GAMING COUNTIES STATE-ASSISTED INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM TO INCLUDE ANY PROJECT AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS ON, ALONG AND APPROACHING U.S. HIGHWAY 90 IN THE CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS WHICH THE MISSISSIPPI TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION DETERMINES WILL ALLEVIATE TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN THE CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS;
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 65-39-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:

AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

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- 11 65-39-1. (1) The Mississippi Transportation Commission is
- 12 authorized, subject to the availability of funds in the Gaming
- 13 Counties State-Assisted Infrastructure Fund created in Section
- 14 65-39-17, to conduct feasibility studies and, pursuant to
- 15 information gathered in such studies, select routes and locations,
- 16 perform preliminary engineering, acquire necessary right-of-way
- 17 and property, construct and/or reconstruct and improve existing or
- 18 new highways, roads, streets and bridges, including two-lane,
- 19 four-lane and multi-lane roads (or segments thereof), perform
- 20 intersection improvements, provide signal retiring, turnbay
- 21 extensions, additional interchanges and other traffic
- 22 modifications, within and approaching those counties in this state
- 23 where legal gaming is being conducted or is authorized. Any
- 24 highway, road, street or bridge that is authorized to be
- 25 constructed, reconstructed or improved shall meet design standards
- 26 established by the Mississippi Department of Transportation, shall
- 27 be constructed to bear a load limit of at least eighty thousand
- 28 (80,000) pounds and, upon completion, shall become a part of the
- 29 state highway system, and thereafter shall be under the

- 30 jurisdiction of the Mississippi Transportation Commission and the
- 31 Mississippi Department of Transportation for construction and
- 32 maintenance.
- 33 (2) The projects authorized in subsection (1) of this
- 34 section shall include, but shall not be limited to, highways,
- 35 roads, streets and bridges on and along the following locations:
- 36 (a) U.S. Highway 90 from its intersection with
- 37 Mississippi 607 in Hancock County to Ocean Springs, and including
- 38 Lakeshore Road in Hancock County from its intersection with U.S.
- 39 Highway 90 to Beach Boulevard;
- 40 (b) Mississippi 4 from U.S. Highway 61 to Mississippi
- 41 3;
- 42 (c) Mississippi 4 from Mississippi 3 to Senatobia;
- 43 (d) Lorraine/Cowan Road from U.S. Highway 90 to I-10;
- 44 (e) U.S. Highway 49 from U.S. Highway 90 to I-10 in
- 45 Gulfport;
- 46 (f) Mississippi 304 beginning at the Tennessee state
- 47 line at or near U.S. 72 and thence running in a southwesterly
- 48 direction to intersect with U.S. 78 at or near Byhalia and thence
- 49 running in a westerly direction to intersect I-55 at or near
- 50 Hernando and thence running in a westerly direction to intersect
- 51 with U.S. 61 in DeSoto County, with a spur extending southwesterly
- 52 to or near Robinsonville in Tunica County;
- 53 (g) I-10 from Exit 28 to Exit 57;
- 54 (h) A new location from the northernmost point on I-110
- 55 to U.S. 49;
- 56 (i) U.S. Highway 61 from the Tunica County line to the
- 57 Tennessee state line;
- (j) (i) Four-lanes for traffic along Mississippi 16
- 59 beginning at its intersection with Mississippi 25 and extending
- 60 easterly to join the existing four-lane on the west side of
- 61 Carthage within the corporate boundaries;

- (ii) Passing lanes and turn lanes, as needed,
- 63 along Mississippi 16 beginning at a point on the east side of
- 64 Carthage within the corporate boundaries where the existing
- 65 four-lane ends and extending easterly to the Leake/Neshoba county
- 66 line; and
- 67 (iii) Four-lanes for traffic along Mississippi 16
- 68 beginning at the Leake/Neshoba county line and extending easterly
- 69 to not more than ten (10) miles east of Mississippi 15;
- 70 (k) Lorraine/Cowan Road Extension from I-10 North to
- 71 relocated/reconstructed Mississippi 67;
- 72 (1) At various locations on and along U.S. Highway 82
- 73 and Mississippi 1 in the City of Greenville;
- 74 (m) At various locations on and along I-20, U.S.
- 75 Highway 61 and U.S. Highway 80 in the City of Vicksburg, including
- 76 a truck route from Harbor Industrial Park to U.S. Highway 61 north
- 77 and an extension of South Frontage Road with railroad bridge to
- 78 I-20;
- 79 (n) At various locations on and along U.S. Highway 61,
- 80 U.S. Highway 65 and Washington Street in the City of Natchez;
- 81 (o) At various locations on and along U.S. Highway 90
- 82 in the City of Pass Christian;
- 83 (p) Mississippi 43/603 beginning where the existing
- 84 four-lane ends north of I-10 and extending northerly to a point
- 85 approximately one (1) mile north of Kiln where Mississippi 43/603
- 86 divides into Mississippi 43 and Mississippi 603;
- 87 (q) Mississippi 43 beginning where Mississippi 43 and
- 88 Mississippi 603 divide and extending northwesterly to or near
- 89 Picayune;
- 90 (r) U.S. 49 from U.S. 61 west to the Mississippi River
- 91 bridge;
- 92 (s) Subject to the conditions prescribed in subsection
- 93 (3) of this section, a central Harrison County connector from I-10

- 94 to U.S. 90 in the vicinity of Canal Road to the Mississippi State
- 95 Port at Gulfport; \* \* \*
- 96 (t) An east Harrison County connector from U.S. 90 to
- 97 I-10 to be located between the Cowan-Lorraine Road interchange and
- 98 the I-110 interchange; and
- 99 (u) At various locations on, along and approaching U.S.
- 100 Highway 90 in the City of Ocean Springs which the Mississippi
- 101 Transportation Commission determines will alleviate traffic
- 102 congestion in the City of Ocean Springs.
- 103 (3) Authorization for the project described in paragraph
- 104 (2)(s) of this section is conditioned upon receipt by the
- 105 Mississippi Transportation Commission of a written commitment by
- 106 the Mississippi Development Authority to make available for such
- 107 project not less than Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00).
- 108 (4) All planning, construction, reconstruction and
- 109 performance of the projects authorized under this section,
- 110 including the letting of contracts, shall commence, proceed and be
- 111 performed by the Mississippi Transportation Commission and the
- 112 Mississippi Department of Transportation according to priorities
- 113 based on volume capacity and traffic congestion in comparative
- 114 project areas; however, if a project authorized in this section is
- 115 also included in the four-lane highway program under Section
- 116 65-3-97, then all contracts necessary to be let for the completion
- 117 of the project under this section shall be let not later than the
- 118 priorities established for the letting of contracts for the
- 119 project under Section 65-3-97.
- 120 (5) (a) Funds for the projects authorized under this
- 121 section may be provided through the issuance of bonds under
- 122 Sections 65-39-5 through 65-39-33, through the issuance of notes
- 123 for such purposes under Section 31-17-127 or from such monies as
- 124 may be available in the Gaming Counties State-Assisted
- 125 Infrastructure Fund created under Section 65-39-17.

126	(b) In addition to the funds provided for under
127	paragraph (a) of this subsection, funds for the project described
128	in subsection (2)(s) of this section also may be provided from any
129	available federal, state, county or municipal funds authorized for
130	such project, including the Economic Development Highway Act.
131	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
132	and after July 1, 2002.
