HOUSE BILL NO. 718

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF INTERPRETERS AND 1 TRANSLITERATORS IN ALL COURTS OF THE STATE; TO AMEND SECTION 2 3 99-17-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) The director shall establish a program to 6

facilitate the use of interpreters and transliterators in all 7 courts of the State of Mississippi. 8

9 (2) (a) The director shall prescribe the qualifications of 10 and certify persons who may serve as certified interpreters and transliterators in all courts of the State of Mississippi in 11 bilingual proceedings and proceedings involving the hearing 12 impaired, whether or not also speech impaired. 13

The director shall maintain a current master list (b) of all interpreters and transliterators certified by him and shall 15 report annually to the Supreme Court on the frequency of requests 16 17 for and the use and effectiveness of the interpreters and transliterators. 18

(3) In all state court bilingual proceedings and proceedings 19 involving the hearing impaired, whether or not also speech 20 impaired, the presiding judicial officer, with the assistance of 21 the director, shall utilize the services of a certified 22 interpreter or transliterator to communicate verbatim all spoken 23 words or signs, illustrating alphabetical letters or words, in 24 American Sign Language, signed English, or spoken English. 25

26 (4) All state courts shall maintain on file in the office of the clerk of the court a list of all persons who have been 27 certified as interpreters or transliterators by the director in 28

29 accordance with the certification program established pursuant to 30 this section.

31 (5) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise 32 requires:

(a) "Deaf person" means a person with a hearing loss so
 great as to prevent his understanding language spoken in a normal
 tone;

36 (b) "Director" means the Director of the Administrative37 Office of the Courts.

(6) Interpreters and transliterators shall be paid a
 reasonable compensation, as set by the court, payable out of the
 county treasury.

41 **SECTION 2.** Section 99-17-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 42 amended as follows:

99-17-7. In criminal cases, the court may <u>utilize</u> an
interpreter <u>or transliterator as provided in Section 1 of this act</u>
when necessary, sworn truly to interpret, and allow him a
reasonable compensation, as set by the court, payable out of the
county treasury.

48 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 49 and after July 1, 2002.
