## HOUSE BILL NO. 859

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-67-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO EXTEND FROM JANUARY 1, 2002, TO JULY 1, 2002, THE PERIOD OF TIME WITHIN WHICH MASSAGE THERAPISTS WHO ARE QUALIFIED UNDER THE 2 3 4 GRANDFATHERING EXEMPTION MUST REGISTER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MISSISSIPPI PROFESSIONAL MASSAGE THERAPY ACT; TO REQUIRE THE STATE 5 BOARD OF MASSAGE THERAPY TO ADVERTISE THE REQUIREMENT THAT MASSAGE 6 THERAPISTS MUST REGISTER UNDER THE ACT AND THAT CERTAIN THERAPISTS 7 ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THE GRANDFATHERING EXEMPTION; TO AMEND SECTION 73-67-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR 8 9 10 RELATED PURPOSES.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. Section 73-67-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows:

73-67-21. (1) No person may advertise massage or practice 14 massage for compensation in this state unless he is registered as 15 a massage therapist by the board. No person may use the title of 16 or represent himself to be a massage therapist or use any other 17 title, abbreviations, letters, figures, signs or devices that 18 indicate that such person is a massage therapist unless he is 19 registered to practice massage therapy under the provisions of 20 this chapter. Massage establishments shall be exempt from the 21 advertising provisions found in Section 73-67-29 provided that 22 such therapy or service is performed by person(s) registered under 23 this chapter. 24

25 (2) The following are requirements for registration:

(a) An applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age, or
older, on the date the application is submitted.

(b) An application must provide proof of high schoolgraduate equivalency.

30 (c) An applicant must be of legal status not only to 31 receive a certificate of registration, but also to work in the 32 State of Mississippi with such certificate of registration.

(d) An applicant must supply proof of current
certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid
of at least eight (8) hours of training, including practical
testing, and supply documentation of familiarity with The
Americans With Disabilities Act.

38 (e) All required fees for registration must be39 submitted by the applicant.

40 (f) Any and all requirements regarding good moral
41 character and competency, as provided for in this chapter and in
42 accepted codes of ethics, shall be met.

(g) An applicant must have completed an approved
continuing education course on communicable diseases, including
HIV/AIDS information and prevention.

The applicant's official and certified 46 (h) 47 transcript(s) from the applicant's massage therapy school. Such transcript must verify that the applicant has completed a 48 49 board-approved training program of no less than the minimum requirement for supervised in-class massage therapy instruction 50 51 and student clinic, with a minimum grade requirement of "C" or better in every course of instruction, as stated for school 52 requirements; or if the applicant is submitting criteria from an 53 54 apprenticeship program, all required documentation, forms and other board-stipulated requirements must be met. 55

(3) The following pre-act practitioners are exempt from
having to take any examination for registration, but must fulfill
all other requirements as stated in this chapter, except for the
requirements in subsection (2) (h) of this section:

(a) Those having more than three hundred (300)
documented, board-accepted in-class hours of massage therapy
education before January 1, 2001.

professional massage therapy experience and a minimum of one
hundred fifty (150) hours of approved massage therapy education
before January 1, 2001.

(c) Those having no formal training, but who have
successfully passed the National Certification Examination for
Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork.

70 (d) All grandfathering exemption allowances as stated in this section shall end on July 1, 2002, for nonstudents, and on 71 June 1, 2003, for students who were enrolled in a part-time 72 73 massage school curriculum on July 1, 2001. Individuals may apply for a certificate of registration until the grandfathering 74 75 exemption ends, but may not practice massage beyond the allowed grace period as provided for in Section 73-67-37 unless a valid 76 massage therapy certificate of registration or provisional permit 77 is obtained. All other pre-act practitioners and anyone not 78 practicing massage therapy before January 1, 2001, must take and 79 80 pass the registration examination and follow the requirements in this chapter to practice massage therapy for compensation in 81 82 Mississippi.

(e) Students enrolled in a massage therapy curriculum
of at least five hundred (500) hours on July 1, 2001, who complete
graduation from the same curriculum.

The provisions of this section which require 86 (4) 87 registration of massage therapists, including the grandfathering exemption allowances described in subsection (3)(d), shall be 88 89 advertised by the board within forty-five (45) days after the effective date of this act. The advertisement shall be published 90 once each week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of 91 general circulation in each county, and it shall not be placed in 92 any portion of the newspaper where legal notices and classified 93 94 advertisements appear. The cost of publishing the advertisement

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95 shall be paid by the board out of funds collected under authority

96 <u>of Section 73-67-15.</u>

97 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-67-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 98 amended as follows:

99 73-67-37. The grace period for certificates of registration to be issued shall be from the effective date of this act until 100 July 1, 2002. Those meeting the minimum requirements as stated in 101 this chapter, except for obtaining a certificate of registration, 102 may continue the practice of massage therapy or instruction 103 thereof within the grace period. Massage curriculums that begin 104 105 before July 1, 2001, may continue with the same curriculum until completion. Anyone not meeting the minimum requirements as stated 106 in this chapter shall not advertise massage therapy or instruction 107 108 thereof until they meet the minimum requirements of this chapter. SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 109

110 and after its passage.
