HOUSE BILL NO. 963

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSURE AND REGULATION OF HOME 1 INSPECTORS; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 2 ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACT BY THE MISSISSIPPI REAL ESTATE COMMISSION; TO CREATE A HOME INSPECTOR REGULATORY BOARD; TO 3 4 PRESCRIBE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR A LICENSE; TO REQUIRE ALL HOME 5 6 INSPECTORS TO CARRY CERTAIN GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE AND ERRORS 7 AND OMISSIONS INSURANCE; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN LIABILITY PROTECTIONS; TO PROVIDE STANDARDS OF PRACTICE AND CODE OF ETHICS; TO PROVIDE 8 EXEMPTIONS FROM THE ACT; TO PROVIDE CONTINUING EDUCATION 9 REQUIREMENTS BEFORE RENEWAL OF A LICENSE; TO PROVIDE RECIPROCITY 10 FOR NONRESIDENT HOME INSPECTORS; TO PROHIBIT THE UNLICENSED PRACTICE OF HOME INSPECTION AND PROVIDE CIVIL PENALTIES THEREFOR; 11 12 TO PROVIDE FEE REQUIREMENTS FOR HOME INSPECTORS LICENSE AND CREATE THE HOME INSPECTORS LICENSE FUND; TO PROVIDE FOR DISCIPLINARY 13 14 PROCEEDINGS; TO REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI REAL ESTATE COMMISSION TO 15 MAINTAIN A ROSTER OF LICENSEES; TO ALLOW CERTAIN PERSONS ALREADY 16 ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF HOME INSPECTIONS TO QUALIFY FOR A 17 LICENSE WITHOUT EXAMINATION; TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD TO EMPLOY LEGAL COUNSEL WHEN NECESSARY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 18 19

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 21 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The following words shall have the meaning 22 ascribed in this section unless the context clearly indicates

23 otherwise:

(a) "Client" means any person who engages or seeks to
engage the services of a home inspector for the purpose of
obtaining an inspection of and written report on the conditions of
a residential building.

(b) "Home inspection" means the process by which a home
inspector examines the observable systems and components of
improvements to residential real property that are readily
accessible.

32 (c) "Home inspection report" means a written evaluation
 33 prepared and issued by a home inspector concerning the condition
 34 of the improvements to residential real property.

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35 (d) "Home inspector" means any person, who for36 compensation, conducts a home inspection.

37 (e) "Board" means the Home Inspector Regulatory Board38 that is created pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

(f) "Residential real property" means a structure
intended to be, or that is in fact, used as a residence and
consisting of one (1) to four (4) family dwelling units.

42 (g) "Commission" means the Mississippi Real Estate43 Commission as established under Section 73-35-5.

44 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This act shall be administered and enforced by 45 the Mississippi Real Estate Commission, which shall have the 46 duties and powers to:

47 (a) Receive applications for licensure as a home
48 inspector under this chapter, establish appropriate administrative
49 procedures for the processing of applications and issue licenses
50 to qualified applicants pursuant to the provisions of this
51 chapter;

(b) Implement recommendations made to the commission by the Home Inspector Regulatory Board with respect to upgrading and improving the experience, education and examination requirements that are required for a home inspector license;

56 (c) Adopt and publish a code of ethics and standards of57 practice for persons licensed under this act;

58 (d) Collect all licensing fees required or permitted by59 this chapter;

(e) Take appropriate action upon a decision and the
related findings of fact made by the board if, after an
administrative hearing, the board (i) determines that a license
home inspector under this chapter has violated the code of ethics
and standards established under this section and (ii) recommends
that the license of the home inspector be suspended or revoked,
that renewal be denied, or that some other disciplinary action be

67 taken;

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(f) Develop and adopt a licensing examination, which
would meet nationally recognized standards, to determine the
knowledge of an applicant of the home inspector profession;

(g) Solicit bids and enter into contracts with one or more educational testing services or organizations approved by the board for the preparation of questions and answers for licensure examinations under this chapter;

(h) Develop the application and license forms;
(i) Adopt rules and regulations for the administration
of this chapter that are not inconsistent with the provisions of
this chapter or the Constitution and laws of Mississippi or of the
United States;

(j) Employ an assistant to the commission administrator
who shall keep a record of all proceedings, transactions,
communications and official acts of the commission and board and
perform such other duties as the commission and board may require;
and

(k) Employ such other staff and technical assistance as
may be necessary to properly administer the requirements of this
chapter.

88 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) There is hereby created, as an adjunct board 89 to the Mississippi Real Estate Commission, a board to be known as 90 the Home Inspector Regulatory Board, which shall consist of five 91 (5) members appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent 92 of the Senate, to include one (1) representative from each 93 congressional district, one (1) from the state at large and all 94 shall be licensed home inspectors.

95 (2) The Home Inspector Regulatory Board shall advise the 96 commission or its designee on all matters relating to this act. 97 The board shall meet no less than four (4) times annually and 98 shall be reimbursed for expenses on a per diem basis pursuant to 99 state law.

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100 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Home Inspectors Regulatory Board shall
101 have the duties and powers to:

102 (a) Be responsible for matters relating to home
103 inspectors code of ethics and standards, home inspector
104 qualifications, testing standards and disciplinary functions.

(b) Hold meetings, public hearings and administrative
hearings and prepare examination specifications for licensed home
inspectors.

Conduct investigations, subpoena individuals and 108 (C) records, administer oaths, take testimony and receive evidence and 109 110 to do all other things necessary and proper to discipline a person licensed under this act and to enforce this act. In case of 111 contumacy by, or refusal to obey a subpoena issued to, any person, 112 the Chancery Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, 113 Mississippi, upon application by the commission, may issue to this 114 person an order requiring him to appear before the commission, or 115 the officer designated by him, there to produce documentary 116 117 evidence if so ordered or to give evidence touching the matter under investigation or in question. Failure to obey the order of 118 the court may be punished by the court as contempt of court. 119

(d) Further define by regulation, the type of
educational experience, home inspector experience and equivalent
experience that will meet the statutory requirements.

(e) Recommend suspension or revocation of licenses
pursuant to the disciplinary proceedings provided for in this
chapter.

(f) Present an annual budget to the Mississippi
Legislature for approval. A copy of the budget shall be given to
the commission.

(2) The members of the commission and board shall be immune
from any civil action or criminal prosecution for initiating or
assisting in any lawful investigation of the actions of, or
participating in any disciplinary proceeding concerning, a home

No. 963 02/HR12/R1901 PAGE 4 (MS\DO) inspector licensed pursuant to this chapter, provided that such action is taken without malicious intent and in the reasonable belief that the action was taken pursuant to the powers and duties vested in the members of the commission and board under this chapter.

138 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) No person may engage in or transact any home 139 inspection business, or hold himself out to the public as a home 140 inspector, or offer to engage in or transact any home inspection 141 business in this state unless the person is licensed by the 142 commission.

No license shall be issued under the provisions of this 143 (2) act to a partnership, association, corporation, limited liability 144 145 company or partnership, firm or group. However, nothing in this act precludes a licensed home inspector from performing home 146 inspection for and on behalf of a partnership, association, 147 corporation, limited liability company or partnership, firm or 148 group or from entering into contracts or enforcing contracts as 149 150 partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company or partnership, firm or group. 151

152 SECTION 6. (1) An application for an original license shall be made in writing to the commission on forms as the commission 153 154 may prescribe and shall be accompanied by the required fee and proof of liability insurance and errors and omissions insurance. 155 (2) To qualify for a license under this act, a person shall: 156 157 (a) Have successfully completed high school or its equivalent; 158

(b) Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
(c) Have successfully completed an approved course of
study of at least sixty (60) hours that may include field work as
prescribed by the commission;

163 (d) Have passed an examination as prescribed by the164 commission; and

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(e) Provide a certificate of insurance for errors and
omissions and general liability insurance (in the required
amounts) pursuant to Section 8 of this act.

The commission must review each application for a 168 (3) 169 license submitted to it and must notify each applicant that the application is either accepted or rejected. The commission must 170 171 send notification of acceptance or rejections to the applicant at the address provided by the applicant in the application within 172 thirty (30) days of receiving the application. If the application 173 is rejected, the notice sent to the applicant must state the 174 175 reasons for the rejection.

176SECTION 7.(1) All home inspectors are required to carry177general liability insurance and errors and omissions insurance.

178 (2) Such policy and certificates shall provide that
179 cancellation or nonrenewal of the policy shall not be effective
180 unless and until at least ten (10) days notice of cancellation or
181 nonrenewal has been received in writing by the commission.

182 (3) (a) For home inspectors doing the majority of their business in cities with less than twenty-eight thousand (28,000) 183 184 in population, the insurance coverage limits shall be no less than 185 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) for general 186 liability insurance and no less than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) for errors and omissions insurance per 187 188 occurrence.

189 (b) Home inspectors doing a majority of their business in cities with twenty-eight thousand (28,000) or more in 190 population shall file with the commission a surety bond in the sum 191 of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) conditioned to satisfy any 192 judgment rendered by a court of competent jurisdiction in favor of 193 194 any person who has sustained damages resulting from the services of the home inspector. Such bond shall be executed by the home 195 196 inspector and a resident surety company qualified to transact 197 business within the state. In addition, these home inspectors are

H. B. No. 963 02/HR12/R1901 PAGE 6 (MS\DO) required to carry insurance coverage limits of no less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for general liability insurance and no less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for errors and omissions insurance, per occurrence.

(c) All home inspectors shall file annual statements
with the board detailing where they do business. The commission
shall revoke the license of any home inspector who files a false
statement.

An action by a client to recover damages for 206 **SECTION 8.** (1) any act or omission of a home inspector relating to a home 207 inspection that he conducts shall be commenced within three (3) 208 209 years after the date a home inspection is completed or the action shall be barred. Further, a licensed home inspector shall not be 210 liable for any latent defects that may be contained in the 211 observable systems and components of improvements to residential 212 real property that he has inspected and has issued a home 213 inspection report. 214

215 (2) Any professional who is licensed by the State of Mississippi when acting within the scope of his profession and is 216 217 not a licensed home inspector shall not be liable for the findings, errors, or omissions of the home inspection, provided 218 219 that he has not provided physical work on the residential building; has not committed proven fraud in the real estate 220 transaction; and has no personal or financial interest in the 221 222 ownership of the residential building.

(3) Any person who in good faith or intention recommends or
endorses a home inspector without compensation, remuneration,
rebate, or any other form of consideration shall not be liable for
the actions of that home inspector, including errors, omissions,
failure to perform any contracted duties of a home inspection, or
failure to meet the standards of practice, report writing
standards, or code of ethics.

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230 <u>SECTION 9.</u> (1) A licensed home inspector is required to 231 follow the Standards of Practice and Code of Ethics as adopted and 232 published by the commission.

(2) A home inspection report must be issued by a homeinspector to a client as specified in the Standards of Practice.

SECTION 10. The requirements of this act shall not prevent 235 the following from performing a visual inspection of a home that 236 is within the scope of their license without further license from 237 238 the board: specialty contractor, general contractor, architect, engineer, insurance adjuster, individual employed by a 239 240 governmental entity, person employed by a bank, savings and loan or credit union, licensed real estate broker or salesperson, a 241 242 licensed appraiser or a home builder.

243 <u>SECTION 11.</u> A license under this act shall expire two (2) 244 years after its date of issuance. The commission may issue a 245 renewal license without examination, on submission of a completed 246 renewal application, payment of the required license renewal fee, 247 and successful completion of continuing education requirements.

SECTION 12. Each person who applies for renewal of his 248 (1) 249 license shall successfully complete home inspector continuing 250 education courses approved by the commission at the rate of twenty 251 (20) hours every two (2) years. No license may be renewed except upon the successful completion of the required courses or their 252 equivalent or upon a waiver of those requirements for good cause 253 254 shown as determined by the commission pursuant to rule with the recommendation of the regulatory board. 255

(2) The commission shall establish criteria for certifying
 providers of continuing education for home inspectors. All such
 continuing education providers must be approved by the commission.

(3) Each renewal applicant shall certify, on his or her
renewal application, full compliance with continuing education
requirements. The provider of approval of continuing education

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shall retain and submit to the commission, after the completion of each course, evidence of those successfully completing the course.

SECTION 13. A home inspector license may be issued to a home 264 265 inspector from another state who satisfies one of the following 266 requirements: (a) holds a valid certificate of certification, registration or home inspector license in good standing issued by 267 another state, which has requirements for licensure substantially 268 269 identical to those of this state, or (b) has passed the examination offered by the American Society of Home Inspectors or 270 the National Association of Home Inspectors. 271

SECTION 14. (1) On or after July 1, 2002, any person who 272 acts as a home inspector, or holds himself out as a home 273 274 inspector, without being licensed under this act, shall, in addition to any other penalty provided by law, be liable for an 275 276 administrative fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a first offense and not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars 277 (\$5,000.00) for a second or subsequent offense as determined by 278 279 the commission.

(2) The commission has the authority and power toinvestigate any and all unlicensed activity.

282 (3) No licensed home inspector may perform repairs on a283 residential building as part of or result of the home inspection.

(4) After October 1, 2002, no person licensed under this act
shall offer to perform or perform inspection services on new
construction for a fee without having first obtained a residential
home builders license from the Mississippi Board of Contractors
and certification by the Southern Building Code Congress or any
other national professional code organization.

290 <u>SECTION 15.</u> The commission shall charge and collect 291 appropriate fees for its services under this chapter. The fees 292 charged shall not exceed the amounts indicated below and shall be 293 set by the board.

All fees charged and collected under this chapter shall be paid by the commission at least once a week, accompanied by a 304 detailed statement thereof, to the credit of the fund known as the 305 306 "Home Inspector License Fund," hereby created in the State Treasury. All monies which are collected under this chapter shall 307 308 be paid into and credited to such fund for the use of the board in carrying out the provisions of the chapter including the payment 309 of salaries and expenses, printing an annual directory of 310 licensees, and for educational purposes. All interest earned on 311 312 the Home Inspector License Fund shall be retained by the board for purposes consistent with this chapter. The commission shall 313 314 submit a monthly statement to the board detailing any expenses which it bears as a share in the expense of administering this 315 316 chapter, for which expenses it shall be reimbursed in the amount 317 approved by the board. The commission shall prepare an annual statement of income and expenses related to its regulatory related 318 319 administrative function.

SECTION 16. The commission may refuse to issue or to renew 320 321 or may revoke or suspend a license or may place on probation, censure, reprimand, or take other disciplinary action with regard 322 to any license issued under this act, including the issuance of 323 324 fines for each violation, for any one (1) or combination of the following causes: 325

326 (a) Violations of this act or the commission's rules 327 promulgated pursuant hereto;

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328 (b) Violation of terms of license probation;

329 (c) Conviction of a felony or making a plea of guilty
 330 or nolo contendere within five (5) years prior to the date of
 331 application;

332 (d) Operating without adequate insurance coverage333 required for licensees; and

334 (e) Fraud in the procurement or performance of a335 contract to conduct a home inspection.

336 <u>SECTION 17.</u> (1) The commission may investigate the actions 337 of an applicant or of a person holding or claiming to hold a 338 license upon complaint in writing of any person setting forth 339 facts which, if proved, would constitute a violation of this act 340 or rules promulgated hereunder.

341 (2) Whenever it appears to the commission that any person
342 has engaged or is about to engage in any act or practice
343 constituting a violation of any provision of this act or any rule
344 or order hereunder, they may, in their discretion, seek any or all
345 of the following remedies:

(a) When in the public interest to prevent harm to the
welfare and safety of the public, issue a cease and desist order,
with or without a prior hearing against the person or persons
engaged in the prohibited activities, directing them to cease and
desist from further illegal activity; or

(b) Bring an action in chancery court to enjoin the acts or practices to enforce compliance with this chapter or any rule or order hereunder. Upon a proper showing a permanent or temporary injunction, restraining order or writ of mandamus shall be granted and a receiver or conservator may be appointed for the defendant or the defendant's assets.

357 (3) With the exception of actions authorized by subsection
358 (2)(a) and (b) above, the commission shall, before taking any
359 disciplinary action that it may deem proper with regard to a
360 license, at least twenty (20) days prior to the date set for a

Such written notice may be served by personal delivery or certified or registered mail at the licensee's last known address as reflected on their licensing application.

366 (4) The commission shall, after a hearing, issue an order
 367 either issuing, renewing, refusing to issue or renew, reinstating,
 368 or revoking the license.

369 <u>SECTION 18.</u> (1) Upon the revocation or suspension of a 370 license, the licensee shall immediately surrender the license to 371 the commission. If the licensee fails to do so, the commission 372 shall have the right to seize the license.

373 (2) If circumstances of suspension or revocation so
374 indicate, the commission may require an examination of the
375 licensee before restoring his license.

376 <u>SECTION 19.</u> The commission shall maintain a roster of names 377 and addresses of all licenses and of all persons whose licenses 378 have been suspended or revoked. This roster shall be published on 379 a web site designated by the commission. All licensees under this 380 act shall inform the commission of any change in their business or 381 home address.

382 SECTION 20. A person already engaged in the business of 383 performing home inspections on July 1, 2002, is allowed ninety (90) days from July 1, 2002, to comply with the provisions of this 384 385 act for the purpose of qualifying to perform home inspections. Such person will qualify for a license without being required to 386 take an examination if he can document to the satisfaction of the 387 commission that he has conducted not less than twenty (20) 388 389 fee-paid home inspections in the previous twelve (12) months or 390 one hundred (100) fee-paid home inspections over his career or that he has received certification as a home inspector from a 391 392 nationally recognized education center in a curriculum approved by

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393 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and 394 the United States Department of Education.

SECTION 21. The information contained in or filed with any 395 396 registration application or renewal application is subject to 397 public disclosure. Information in the possession of, submitted to or obtained by the commission in connection with any investigation 398 or examination under this act shall be confidential and exempt 399 400 from the requirements of the Mississippi Public Records Act of No such information may be disclosed by the commission or 401 1983. its employees unless necessary or appropriate in connection with a 402 403 particular investigation or proceeding under this act or for any 404 law enforcement purpose, in the absence of an order of a court of 405 competent jurisdiction requiring such disclosure.

406 <u>SECTION 22.</u> Any condition, stipulation or provision binding 407 any person engaging the services of a home inspector to waive 408 compliance with any provision of this act or any rule or order 409 hereunder is void.

410 **SECTION 23.** The board may employ legal counsel to represent 411 it in any proceedings when legal counsel is required.

412 **SECTION 24.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 413 and after July 1, 2002.
