HOUSE BILL NO. 991

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE TAX SYSTEM OF THIS 1 STATE AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM SUCH STUDY TO THE 2 3 LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. (1) There is created a task force to study the 5 tax system of Mississippi for the purpose of finding additional 6 sources of revenue for local government. The task force shall 7 make a report of its findings and recommendations to the 8 Legislature during the 2003 Regular Legislative Session and each 9 regular legislative session thereafter, including any recommended 10 legislation. 11 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following 12 13 twenty-five (25) members: Ten (10) members appointed by the Speaker of the 14 (a) Mississippi House of Representatives as follows: 15 (i) The Speaker Pro Tempore of the House; 16 (ii) The Chairman of the House Ways and Means 17 18 Committee; The Chairman of the House Appropriations 19 (iii) 20 Committee; 21 (iv) Two (2) certified public accountants from a 22 list of twenty (20) certified public accountants submitted by the State Board of Public Accountancy; 23 Two (2) representatives of the Mississippi 24 (v) Supervisors Association; 25 26 (vi) Two (2) representatives of the Mississippi 27 Municipal Association; and H. 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(vii) A representative of the general public; 28 29 (b) Ten (10) members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Mississippi as follows: 30 (i) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate; 31 32 (ii)The Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee; 33 (iii) The Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee; 34 Two (2) certified public accountants from a (iv) 35 list of twenty (20) certified public accountants submitted by the 36 State Board of Public Accountancy; 37 38 (v) A representative of the Mississippi Manufacturers Association; 39 40 (vi) A representative of the Taxation Section of the Mississippi Bar; 41 (vii) Three (3) representatives of the general 42 public; and 43 Five (5) members appointed by the Governor of the 44 (C) 45 State of Mississippi as follows: The Chairman of the Mississippi State Tax 46 (i) 47 Commission; (ii) The Executive Director of the Mississippi 48 49 Department of Economic and Community Development; and 50 (iii) Three (3) representatives of the general public. 51 52 (3) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act, and, within fifteen (15) days 53 thereafter on a day to be designated jointly by the Speaker of the 54 House and the Lieutenant Governor, the task force shall meet and 55 organize by selecting from its membership a chairman and a vice 56 chairman. The vice chairman shall also serve as secretary and 57 shall be responsible for keeping all records of the task force. 58 Α 59 majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a In the selection of its officers and the adoption of 60 quorum. 02/HR40/R1589 PAGE 2 (MS\BD) rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the task force shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, such notices to be mailed at least fifteen (15) days before the date on which a meeting is to be held.

(4) The principal goals of the task force are to find an
additional revenue source for local governments and to study the
current tax structure of the state and make recommendations
regarding the imposition of state taxes and the granting of tax
exemptions in all areas of taxation including, but not limited to,
sales taxes, income taxes, privilege taxes, fuel taxes, diversions
of taxes and the relationship between state and local taxes.

73 (5) Members of the task force who are not legislators, state officials or state employees shall be compensated at the per diem 74 75 rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and shall be reimbursed in accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses 76 incurred in the performance of their duties. Legislative members 77 78 of the task force shall be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for 79 80 committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session. However, no per diem or expense for attending meetings of the task 81 82 force will be paid while the Legislature is in session. No task force member may incur per diem, travel or other expenses unless 83 previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the task force, 84 85 which action shall be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting. Nonlegislative members shall be paid from any funds made 86 87 available to the task force for that purpose.

(6) The task force shall use clerical and legal staff
already employed by the State Tax Commission and the Mississippi
Municipalities League and any other staff assistance made
available to it. To effectuate the purpose of this section, any
department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the
state or of any political subdivision thereof shall, at the
