HOUSE BILL NO. 1028

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-35-101, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF EVERY COUNTY TO ADVERTISE 3 FOR REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS FOR CONTRACTS FOR SURVEYS, APPRAISALS, 4 MAPPING AND THE RELATED MAINTENANCE OR UPDATES FOR AD VALOREM 5 TAXATION PURPOSES AND GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS PURPOSES; 6 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 27-35-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 27-35-101. The board of supervisors of any county in this state is hereby authorized in its discretion, to have the 11 cultivatable, uncultivatable, or timbered lands of any owner, or 12 of the entire county or any part thereof, surveyed and the acreage 13 thereof determined and the value of the lands and of any timber, 14 buildings or improvements thereon appraised by a competent person 15 or persons, to be selected by the board of supervisors, the cost 16 thereof to be paid from the general county fund. The board of 17 supervisors of any county is hereby authorized to have the lots 18 and blocks or other tracts in the municipalities of the county 19 surveyed and the area determined, and the valuation thereof and of 20 any buildings, structures, or other improvements thereon, 21 appraised for the purpose of taxation in the same manner and at 22 the same time that lands outside of municipalities are surveyed 23 24 and appraised. Before entering into any contract for surveys, mapping, appraisals and the related maintenance or updates for 25 taxation purposes or for geographical information systems purposes 26 that involves an expenditure of more than Fifty Thousand Dollars 27 (\$50,000.00), the board of supervisors shall issue publicly a 28 request for proposals concerning the specifications for such 29 H. 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services. The request for proposals shall be advertised in the 30 31 same manner as provided under Section 31-7-13(c) for seeking bids 32 for purchases that involve an expenditure of more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). A request for proposals shall 33 34 contain terms and conditions relating to price, financial responsibility, technology, legal responsibilities and other 35 relevant factors as determined relevant by the board of 36 supervisors. All factors determined relevant by the board of 37 supervisors or as required by this section shall be included in 38 the advertisement to elicit proposals. After responses to the 39 40 request for proposal or proposals have been received, the board of supervisors shall select the most qualified proposal or proposals 41 on the basis of price, technology and other relevant factors and 42 from such proposals, but not limited to the terms thereof, shall 43 negotiate and enter into contract with one or more persons or 44 firms submitting the proposals. If the board of supervisors deems 45 none of the proposals to be qualified or otherwise acceptable, the 46 47 request for proposals process may be reinitiated. When such survey and appraisal is made, a permanent record thereof shall be 48 49 made and preserved by the clerk of the board of supervisors, to which the tax assessor of the county shall at all times have 50 51 access.

The board of supervisors of any county in this state having 52 within its boundaries a municipality with a population in excess 53 of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) according to the latest 54 federal census, is authorized to secure from such municipality 55 56 surveys, appraisals and related materials made or caused to be made by it for the valuation for assessment purposes of property 57 located in such municipality, and to pay to such municipality 58 therefor out of the general county fund such sum or sums as may be 59 60 agreed upon between such board of supervisors and the governing 61 authorities of such municipality, all of which may be done without

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62 the necessity of publication of notice for or the reception of63 bids.

64 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 65 and after July 1, 2002.
