HOUSE BILL NO. 1070 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE MISSISSIPPI ACCESS TO CARE (MAC) 1 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO COORDINATE THE IMPLEMENTATION, FUNDING AND 2 ANY NEEDED REVISIONS OF THE MAC PLAN; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 3 MEMBERSHIP AND APPOINTMENT OF THE COMMITTEE; TO SPECIFY THE DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMITTEE AND THE DEPARTMENT 4 5 OF MENTAL HEALTH, THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF REHABILITATION SERVICES, 6 THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 7 EDUCATION AND THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID EACH SHALL PERFORM CERTAIN FUNCTIONS IN IMPLEMENTING THE MAC PLAN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 11 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established the Mississippi Access to Care (MAC) Oversight Committee to coordinate the 12 implementation, funding and any needed revisions of the MAC plan 13 dated September 30, 2001, that was prepared and submitted to the 14 Legislature as required under Sections 43-57-1 through 43-57-9. 15 16 (2)The MAC Oversight Committee shall be composed of: Four (4) members appointed by the Governor, each of 17 (a) whom must be a person with a disability; 18 19 (b) A representative of the Governor's office; The Chairs and Vice Chairs of the Public Health and 20 (C)21 Welfare Committee and the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives; and 22 23 (d) The Chairs and Vice Chairs of the Public Health and 24 Welfare Committee and the Appropriations Committee of the Senate. 25 Of the Governor's appointments, one (1) member shall be (3) appointed from each of the four (4) congressional districts as 26 constituted on July 1, 2002. The initial appointments by the 27 Governor shall be as follows: Two (2) members shall be appointed 28 for terms ending on June 30, 2004, and two (2) members shall be 29 30 appointed for terms ending on June 30, 2006. All subsequent

appointments shall be for terms of four (4) years from the expiration date of the previous term. Any vacancy before the expiration of a term shall be filled by appointment of the Governor, and the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

36 (4) At the first meeting of the committee, the members shall 37 select one (1) of the legislative members to serve as chair of the 38 committee. The committee shall select a chair from among the 39 legislative members once every two (2) years, and the chair shall 40 alternate between the members from the House of Representatives 41 and the members from the Senate.

The appointed members and the legislative members of the 42 (5) 43 committee shall receive a per diem in the amount provided under Section 25-3-69 for each day engaged in the official business of 44 the committee. The appointed members of the committee shall 45 receive reimbursement for travel expenses incurred while engaged 46 in official business of the committee in accordance with Section 47 25-3-41, and the legislative members of the committee shall 48 receive the expense allowance provided for in Section 5-1-47. 49 50 However, the legislative members of the committee shall not receive the per diem or expense allowance for any day that the 51 52 committee meets while the Legislature is in session.

53 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The MAC Oversight Committee is ultimately 54 responsible for implementation of the MAC plan. The committee 55 shall continually review and assess the three-part test for states 56 and the three (3) risk zones for states to fulfill the state's 57 obligation to:

58 (a) Divert persons from initially being placed into59 institutions;

(b) Review those persons already in institutions to
determine how many could be and want to be served in a home- and
community-based setting; and

persons to leave the institutional setting to go to a home- and
community-based setting.

(2) The duties of the MAC Oversight Committee are to:

(a) Identify, collect, and disburse data regarding the
number and status of persons with disabilities and the
availability and quality of community services and supports;

(b) Monitor the development and expansion of communityservices and the movement on the waiting list;

(c) Actively and continuously review and recommendmodifications to the MAC plan;

(d) Provide persons with disabilities a process for
independent review and appeal of decisions made by treating
professionals;

(e) Develop the specific criteria and tools to measure the effectiveness of the MAC plan strategies, submit them to the responsible agency or agencies for concurrence, and make an annual report to the Legislature of the outcomes;

81 (f) Hold periodic public meetings to provide82 information and opportunities for input;

(g) Identify specific steps for the provision of a
comprehensive system of support services to persons once they are
identified; and

(h) Establish a baseline for the existing waiting time
for each service, define what constitutes a "reasonable pace" for
providing community services, and design and implement a plan to
move from the current waiting time to a time that is "reasonable."
<u>SECTION 3.</u> In implementing the MAC plan, the MAC Oversight
Committee shall:

94 community-based alternatives available and allow them the option
95 to choose the most integrated setting of their choice;

The plan shall address the following 99 components: 100 (i) Identification of persons with disabilities 101 needing or wanting community-based housing; 102 Support services needed by persons with (ii) 103 disabilities to live independently; and 104 (iii) Funding assistance for housing; Act as the lead entity responsible for developing 105 (C) 106 and implementing a comprehensive transportation plan for all persons with disabilities that will maximize existing resources 107 108 and develop future funding requests; (d) Establish creative transportation initiatives and 109 demonstration projects; 110 Develop a transportation guide for all persons with 111 (e) disabilities; and 112 113 (f) Perform a feasibility study in fiscal year 2004 to determine options for an interagency, consolidated transportation 114 115 plan. **SECTION 4.** In implementing the MAC plan, the Department of 116 Mental Health, the State Department of Rehabilitation Services, 117 the Department of Human Services, the State Department of 118 Education and the Division of Medicaid each shall: 119 120 (a) Develop and maintain an ongoing, comprehensive data collection system for identifying persons with disabilities who 121 122 are receiving or are in need of services and supports from that 123 agency; (b) Develop and implement a comprehensive evaluation 124 procedure ensuring that, where appropriate, each person with 125 disabilities and/or the person's guardian will be involved in the 126 127 assessment and planning process and that the assessment will be

directed toward providing services in the "least restricted, most

129 integrated setting possible" based upon professional

130 recommendations and the choice of the person and his or her 131 family; and

(c) Provide to the MAC Oversight Committee with reports
specifying the agency's budgetary and program implementation
response to the MAC plan. Each agency shall provide the reports
to the committee at least twice annually, and at other times as
required by the committee.

The first report required by this paragraph 137 (i) shall be provided to the committee after the development of the 138 139 agency's budget and before the beginning of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee's hearings on agency budget requests in the fall 140 That report shall detail the portions of the 141 of the year. agency's budget request that would be directed toward the 142 implementation of the MAC plan, including the number of citizens 143 to be served and the specific services to be provided, the amount 144 of money required to provide the services and the source of the 145 146 funding.

147 (ii) The second report required by this paragraph 148 shall be provided to the committee not later than thirty (30) days after the end of the regular session of the Legislature. 149 That 150 report shall include the same information as in the first report, except that it shall detail the portions of the agency's proposed 151 budget that the Legislature funded. The second report also shall 152 153 include a more detailed narrative of the services that must be carried forward to the next budgetary cycle and the services that 154 require amendment due to the funding that was made available. 155

156 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 157 and after July 1, 2002.
