## HOUSE BILL NO. 1212

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-104-13 AND 31-17-123, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXEMPT SPECIAL FUNDS RECEIVED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL UNDER LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACTS WITH STATE AGENCIES FROM THE PROVISIONS AUTHORIZING THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER TO REDUCE STATE AGENCY BUDGETS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 27-104-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

27-104-13. The State Fiscal Officer shall have the right to 9 disapprove or reduce and revise the estimates of general funds and 10 state-source special funds for any general fund or special fund 11 agency, and for the "administration and other expenses" budget of 12 the Department of Transportation, in an amount not to exceed five 13 14 percent (5%) if he finds that funds will not be available within the period for which the budget is drawn, or if he finds that the 15 requested expenditures, or any part thereof, are not authorized by 16 law, and that action shall be reported to the Legislative Budget 17 Office. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of 18 need based upon a finding that funds will not be available within 19 the period for which the budget is drawn, transfer funds as 20 provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working 21 22 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement 23 the general fund revenue. If the estimates of general funds and state-source special funds of all general fund and special fund 24 agencies, and of the "administration and other expenses" budget of 25 the Department of Transportation, have been reduced by five 26 27 percent (5%), additional reductions may be made but shall consist of a uniform percentage reduction of general funds and 28

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state-source special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies, and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the <u>Department of Transportation</u>. Any state-source special funds reduced under the provisions of this section shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions for warrants signed by the respective agency head and <u>the</u> transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined by the State Fiscal Officer.

For the purpose of this section, "state-source special funds" 36 shall be construed to mean any special funds in any agency derived 37 from any source, but shall not include the following special 38 39 funds: special funds derived from federal sources, from local or regional political subdivisions, or from donations; special funds 40 held in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of specific persons 41 or classes of persons; self-generated special funds of the state 42 institutions of higher learning or the state junior colleges; 43 special funds of Mississippi Industries for the Blind, the State 44 Port at Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, Pat Harrison Waterway 45 46 District, Pearl River Basin Development District, Pearl River Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee River Valley Water 47 48 Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed Authority, or Coast Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife, 49 50 Fisheries and Parks derived from the issuance of hunting or fishing licenses; special funds received by the Attorney General 51 under legal services contracts with state agencies; and special 52 53 funds generated by agencies whose primary function includes the establishment of standards and the issuance of licenses for the 54 55 practice of a profession within the State of Mississippi.

56 **SECTION 2.** Section 31-17-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 57 amended as follows:

58 31-17-123. The intent of the Legislature is to authorize 59 borrowing funds under the provisions of Sections 31-17-101 through 60 31-17-123 to offset any temporary cash flow deficiencies and 61 should not be construed to authorize the borrowing of any funds in

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an amount <u>that</u> cannot be repaid during the fiscal year in which
the funds are borrowed.

The State Tax Commission and University Research Center, 64 65 utilizing all available revenue forecast data, shall annually 66 develop a general fund revenue estimate to be adopted by the 67 Legislative Budget Office as of the date of sine die adjournment. If, at the end of October, or at the end of any month thereafter 68 of any fiscal year, the revenues received for the fiscal 69 year \* \* \* fall below ninety-eight percent (98%) of the 70 Legislative Budget Office general fund revenue estimate at the 71 72 date of sine die adjournment, the State Fiscal Officer shall reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds 73 74 to general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Department of 75 Transportation in an amount necessary to keep expenditures within 76 77 the sum of actual general fund receipts including any transfers to 78 the General Fund from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund 79 for the fiscal year. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need based on the revenue shortfall, transfer 80 funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working 81 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement 82 83 the general fund revenue. State-source special funds in an amount equal to any reduction made under the provisions of this section 84 shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions 85 for warrants signed by the respective agency head, and the 86 transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined 87 88 by the State Fiscal Officer. No agency's allocation shall be reduced in an amount to exceed five percent (5%); however, if the 89 allocations of general funds and state-source special funds to all 90 general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration 91 92 and other expenses" budget of the Department of Transportation 93 have been reduced by five percent (5%), any additional reductions required to be made under this section shall consist of a uniform 94 H. 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percentage reduction of general funds and state-source special 95 funds to all general fund and special fund agencies, and to the 96 "administration and other expenses" budget of the Department of 97 Transportation. Any receipt from loans authorized by Sections 98 99 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 shall not be included as revenue receipts. The State Fiscal Officer shall immediately send notice 100 of any action taken under authority of this section to the 101 Legislative Budget Office. 102

For the purpose of this section, "state-source special funds" 103 shall be construed to mean any special funds in any agency derived 104 105 from any source, but shall not include the following special funds: special funds derived from federal sources, from local or 106 107 regional political subdivisions, or from donations; special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of specific persons 108 or classes of persons; self-generated special funds of the state 109 institutions of higher learning or the state junior colleges; 110 special funds of Mississippi Industries for the Blind, the State 111 112 Port at Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, Pat Harrison Waterway District, Pearl River Basin Development District, Pearl River 113 Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee River Valley Water 114 Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed Authority, or Coast 115 116 Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks derived from the issuance of hunting or 117 fishing licenses; special funds received by the Attorney General 118 119 under legal services contracts with state agencies; and special funds generated by agencies whose primary function includes the 120 establishment of standards and the issuance of licenses for the 121 practice of a profession within the State of Mississippi. 122

123 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 124 and after its passage.

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
