HOUSE BILL NO. 1220

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO LOWER THE MINIMUM POPULATION REQUIREMENTS FOR MUNICIPALITIES 2 THAT MAY USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT ON FEDERALLY DESIGNATED HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY; AND FOR RELATED 3 4 5 PURPOSES BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 (1) It is unlawful for any person or peace 9 63-3-519. officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 10 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 11 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 12 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 13 14 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 15 16 upon the public streets of the municipality; (b) By any college or university campus police force 17 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand 18 (2,000) students are enrolled; 19 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 20 21 municipality having a population in excess of seven thousand five 22 hundred (7,500) according to the latest federal census on 23 federally designated highways lying within the corporate limits. The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol may not set up 24 (2) radar on highways within municipalities with a population in 25 excess of seven thousand five hundred (7,500) according to the 26 27 latest federal census.
