Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 63-3-519. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 8 9 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 10 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 11 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 12 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a 13 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 14 upon the public streets of the municipality; 15 (b) By any college or university campus police force 16 17 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand (2,000) students are enrolled; 18 19 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand 20 (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally 21 designated highways lying within the corporate limits; and 22 23 (d) By the sheriff and his deputies on any public road, street or highway outside the corporate limits of a municipality 24 located in a county having a population of one hundred thousand 25 (100,000) or more according to the latest federal decennial 26 27 census.

28 (2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol <u>shall</u> not set up 29 radar on highways within municipalities with a population in 30 excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest 31 federal census.
