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- MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT FAMILY MEMBERS AND CO-OWNERS SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL IN A PARTITION 3
- 4 SALE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 11-21-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- amended as follows: 7
- 11-21-11. If, upon hearing, the court be of the opinion that 8
- 9 a sale of the lands, or any part thereof, will better promote the
- interest of all parties than a partition in kind, or if the court 10
- be satisfied that an equal division cannot be made, it shall order 11
- a sale of the lands, or such part thereof as may be deemed proper, 12
- and a division of the proceeds among the cotenants according to 13
- their respective interests. Remaining family members and 14
- co-owners shall have the right of first refusal in the sale. 15
- 16 court may appoint a master to make the sale, and may make all
- proper orders to protect the rights of the parties interested. 17
- The court may order the sale of a part of the land and the 18
- partition in kind of the residue. 19
- Before the court shall order a sale of the lands, the court 20
- may cause an appraisal to be made of the property, the expense of 21
- which shall be taxed and collected as costs in the proceedings. If 22
- the court causes an appraisal of the property to be made, then, 23
- subsequent to the receipt and filing of the appraisal with the 24
- court, the court shall hold in abeyance its order for sale of the 25
- 26 land for a period of thirty (30) days in order to allow the
- parties the opportunity to reach an agreement as to a partition in 27
- kind or sale of the lands. 28

- SECTION 2. Section 11-21-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 30 amended as follows:
- 31 11-21-27. If, after a judgment for partition and the
- 32 appointment of masters, it shall appear from the report of the
- 33 masters, or on exceptions to their report, that a just and equal
- 34 division of the land cannot be made, or that a sale will better
- 35 promote the interest of all the cotenants, the court shall order a
- 36 sale of the land, or such part thereof as may be deemed proper,
- 37 and a division of the proceeds among those interested, as provided
- 38 for. Family members and co-owners shall have the right of first
- 39 refusal in the sale.
- Before the court shall order a sale of the lands, the court
- 41 may cause an appraisal to be made of the property, the expense of
- 42 which shall be taxed and collected as costs in the proceedings. If
- 43 the court causes an appraisal of the property to be made, then,
- 44 subsequent to the receipt and filing of the appraisal with the
- 45 court, the court shall hold in abeyance its order for sale of the
- 46 land for a period of thirty (30) days in order to allow the
- 47 parties the opportunity to reach an agreement as to a partition in
- 48 kind or sale of the lands.
- 49 **SECTION 3.** Section 11-21-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 50 amended as follows:
- 51 11-21-73. A tenant in common of personal property, not
- 52 exceeding in value the amount provided in Section 9-11-9, may
- 53 apply for a partition of it by petition in writing to the county
- 54 court of the county in which the property or some part of it may
- 55 be, or, in counties not having a county court, to the justice
- 56 court of the county in which the property or some part of it may
- 57 be. Thereupon, all the cotenants shall be summoned and the rights
- 58 of parties ascertained, and an order made for a division of the
- 59 property. If the property be incapable of division in kind
- 60 according to the several interests, or if a sale and division of
- 61 the proceeds will better promote the interests of parties, the

- 62 county court or justice court, as the case may be, shall order a
- 63 sale and a division of its proceeds, and may designate a person to
- 64 make the sale, and may issue execution specially framed to that
- 65 end, and make all orders necessary or proper to protect the rights
- of parties and to effect a sale and division of the proceeds.
- 67 Family members and co-owners shall have the right of first refusal
- 68 in the sale.
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 70 and after July 1, 2002.
