HOUSE BILL NO. 1312

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 29-5-77 AND 29-5-79, MISSISSIPPI 1 CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT, WITH REGARD TO THE NEW CAPITOL 2 3 BUILDING, THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OR THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 4 REPRESENTATIVES MAY REQUEST THE ASSISTANCE OF OFFICERS APPOINTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO ENFORCE THE 5 LAWS AT THE BUILDING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 29-5-77, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 10 29-5-77. The * * * Department of Finance and Administration shall have jurisdiction relative to the enforcement of all laws of 11 the State of Mississippi on the properties set forth in Section 12 29-5-2 and the Court of Appeals Building; provided that, with 13 regard to the New Capitol Building, the Lieutenant Governor or the 14 Speaker of the House of Representatives may request the assistance 15 of officers appointed by the department and assigned to enforce 16 17 the laws at the building. The department is authorized and directed through any person or persons appointed by the Department 18 of Finance and Administration or through the Department of Public 19 Safety when requested by the Department of Finance and 20 Administration, to make arrests for any violation of any law of 21 the State of Mississippi on such grounds of or within such 22 properties. The Department of Finance and Administration is 23 24 hereby empowered and directed to enforce the provisions of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-71 through 29-5-77, and 25 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and to prescribe such rules and 26 27 regulations as are necessary therefor. When in the opinion of the Governor or, in his absence, the 28 Lieutenant Governor, it is readily apparent that an emergency 29

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30 exists which the persons appointed by the Department of Finance 31 and Administration are unable to control in the accomplishment of the provisions of Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-71 32 through 29-5-77, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95 in regard to law 33 34 enforcement, then the Governor, or in his absence, the Lieutenant 35 Governor, may call upon the Department of Public Safety, members of which shall have power to arrest and detain any persons 36 violating the provisions of the aforesaid sections, until such 37 person can be brought before the proper authorities for trial. 38 SECTION 2. Section 29-5-79, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39

40 amended as follows:

29-5-79. (1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives 41 42 and the Lieutenant Governor may make such regulations as they may deem necessary for preserving the peace and securing the New 43 Capitol Building from defacement and for the protection of the 44 property therein. The Lieutenant Governor or the Speaker of the 45 House of Representatives may request the assistance of 46 47 the Department of Finance and Administration and the * * *

48 Department of Public Safety in order to preserve the peace at the 49 <u>New Capitol Building</u> and secure the <u>New Capitol Building</u> from 50 defacement and for the protection of the property therein.

(2) All regulations promulgated under authority of this section shall be filed with the Secretary of State and * * * made available for public inspection; <u>the</u> regulations shall likewise be published in one (1) of the daily newspapers of the City of Jackson and shall not become effective until the expiration of ten (10) days after the date of <u>the</u> filing with the Secretary of State and <u>the</u> publication.

58 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 59 and after its passage.

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
