HOUSE BILL NO. 1319 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-6-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT A PERSON MUST BE A UNITED STATES CITIZEN TO BE LICENSED AS A CHIROPRACTOR; <u>TO REQUIRE ANY APPLICANT</u> FOR A CHIROPRACTIC LICENSE WHO IS NOT A UNITED STATES CITIZEN TO SIGN AN AFFIDAVIT STATING THE PERSON'S INTENTION TO APPLY FOR CITIZENSHIP AT THE EARLIEST DATE THAT HE OR SHE BECOMES ELIGIBLE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 73-6-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

73-6-13. (1) Any adult \* \* \* of good moral character who 11 has (a) graduated from a school or college of chiropractic 12 recognized by the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, preceded 13 by the successful completion of at least two (2) academic years at 14 15 an accredited institution of higher learning, or accredited junior college, and (b) successfully completed parts 1, 2, 3 and 4 and 16 17 the physical modality section of the examination prepared by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners, shall be entitled to 18 take the examination for a license to practice chiropractic in 19 Mississippi. The State Board of Chiropractic Examiners shall keep 20 on file a list of schools or colleges of chiropractic which are so 21 recognized. No chiropractic school shall be approved unless it is 22 23 recognized and approved by the council of chiropractic education, offers an accredited course of study of not less than four (4) 24 academic years of at least nine (9) months in length, and requires 25 its graduates to receive not less than forty (40) clock hours of 26 instruction in the operation of x-ray machinery and not less than 27 28 forty (40) clock hours of instruction in x-ray interpretation and 29 diagnosis.

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Any person who applies to take the examination for a <u>chiropractic license who is not a citizen of the United States</u> <u>must include with the application to the board a signed affidavit</u> <u>stating that the person intends to meet the qualifications and</u> <u>apply for United States citizenship at the earliest date that he</u> <u>or she becomes eligible for citizenship.</u>

36 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the State
37 Board of Health shall prescribe rules and regulations for the
38 operation and use of x-ray machines.

39 (3) The examination to practice chiropractic used by the 40 board shall consist of testing on the statutes and the rules and 41 regulations regarding the practice of chiropractic in the State of 42 Mississippi.

(4) Reciprocity privileges for a chiropractor from another 43 state shall be granted at the board's option on an individual 44 basis and by a majority vote of the State Board of Chiropractic 45 Examiners to an adult \* \* \* of good moral character who (a) is 46 47 currently an active competent practitioner for at least eight (8) years and holds an active chiropractic license in another state 48 49 with no disciplinary proceeding or unresolved complaint pending anywhere at the time a license is to be issued by this state, (b) 50 51 demonstrates having obtained licensure as a chiropractor in another state under the same education requirements which were 52 equivalent to the education requirements in this state to obtain a 53 54 chiropractic license at the time the applicant obtained the license in the other state, (c) satisfactorily passes the 55 examination administered by the State Board of Chiropractic 56 Examiners and the Spec examination prepared by the National Board 57 of Chiropractic Examiners, and (d) meets the requirements of 58 Section 73-6-1(3) pertaining to therapeutic modalities. 59 Any person who applies for a chiropractic license by 60 61 reciprocity who is not a citizen of the United States must include with the application to the board a signed affidavit stating that 62

## 66 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 67 and after July 1, 2002.
