HOUSE BILL NO. 1447

AN ACT TO CREATE A SPECIAL SCHOOL AT THE WALNUT GROVE YOUTH
CORRECTIONAL FACILITY; TO DESCRIBE THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM AND
CURRICULUM THAT MUST BE MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE SCHOOL; TO
PROVIDE THAT THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE SPECIAL SCHOOL SHALL BE THE
WALNUT GROVE CORRECTIONAL AUTHORITY; TO REQUIRE THE SCHOOL BOARD
TO APPOINT A PRINCIPAL FOR THE SCHOOL; TO PROVIDE FOR FUNDING FOR
THE SPECIAL SCHOOL BY LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION; TO PROVIDE FOR
THE EMPLOYMENT AND COMPENSATION OF TEACHERS EMPLOYED BY THE
SPECIAL SCHOOL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** There is created a special school for a special
- 12 population to be located on the grounds of the Walnut Grove Youth
- 13 Correctional Facility. The purpose of the special school is to
- 14 meet the educational needs of the juvenile offenders housed in the
- 15 facility by providing each student with an opportunity to develop
- 16 educational, vocational and living skills.
- 17 **SECTION 2.** (1) The program of education at the special
- 18 school must be designed to meet each student's individual
- 19 educational needs, regardless of the student's grade level. The
- 20 special school shall prepare a written Individual Education
- 21 Program (IEP) or portfolio for each student.
- 22 (2) The special school must meet appropriate State
- 23 Department of Education accreditation standards, as determined by
- 24 the State Board of Education. The special school will be a
- 25 special alternative program for a special population. Training in
- 26 the following areas must be included in the special school's
- 27 curriculum: computer literacy; workplace readiness; life skills;
- 28 drug and alcohol education; and physical education.
- 29 (3) The special school shall provide a program of general
- 30 educational development (GED) preparatory instruction, which

- 31 program must be administered in compliance with the rules and
- 32 regulations established for such programs under Sections 37-35-1
- 33 through 37-35-11 and by the State Board for Community and Junior
- 34 Colleges. The special school may administer the General
- 35 Educational Development (GED) Testing Program under the policies
- 36 and guidelines of the GED Testing Service of the American Council
- 37 on Education. Upon a determination by the special school that it
- 38 is in a student's best interest for that student to receive GED
- 39 preparatory instruction, the special school shall assign the
- 40 student to the GED program.
- 41 (4) The special school, in its discretion, may authorize
- 42 postsecondary academic or vocational courses, or both, to be
- 43 offered to students in the correctional facility who have been
- 44 awarded a high school diploma or GED equivalent. However, no
- 45 state funds may be expended to provide such course offerings
- 46 unless the educational programs for Kindergarten through Grade 12
- 47 have been fully funded.
- 48 **SECTION 3.** The school board of the special school shall be
- 49 the Walnut Grove Correctional Authority. The relationship between
- 50 the correctional authority, as school board of the special school,
- 51 and the State Board of Education shall be the same as that between
- 52 other special schools in the state and the State Board of
- 53 Education. The school board shall exercise the same powers,
- 54 duties and responsibilities prescribed under Title 37, Mississippi
- 55 Code of 1972, and by rules and regulations of the State Board of
- 56 Education for all local school boards.
- 57 **SECTION 4.** (1) There is established the position of
- 58 principal of the special school, which position must be filled by
- 59 the appointment of the Walnut Grove Correctional Authority, as
- 60 school board of the special school. The special school principal
- 61 shall be directly responsible to, and shall serve at the will and
- 62 pleasure of, the school board. The principal must possess the
- 63 qualifications required of all school principals and any other

- 64 qualifications that may be specified by the school board or State
- 65 Board of Education.
- 66 (2) The relationship between the special school principal
- 67 and correctional authority, as school board of the special school,
- 68 and the State Board of Education shall be the same as that between
- 69 other special school principals and the State Board of Education.
- 70 (3) The school principal shall have the general
- 71 responsibility for administering and supervising the educational
- 72 programs of the special school. In addition, the principal shall
- 73 have the specific duty of submitting the school's annual
- 74 educational budget recommendations, as adopted in final form by
- 75 the school board, to the State Board of Education. The budget
- 76 must be based on any funds available to the school for educational
- 77 purposes.
- 78 **SECTION 5.** Funding for the educational programs shall be by
- 79 appropriation of the Legislature specifically for the educational
- 80 programs at the Walnut Grove Youth Correctional Facility, and
- 81 those funds may not be used for any other purpose at that facility
- 82 or any other facility operated under contract with or by the
- 83 Mississippi Department of Corrections.
- 84 SECTION 6. The school board and principal shall establish a
- 85 salary schedule for teachers employed by the special school, with
- 86 consideration given to the unique educational environment of the
- 87 special school within a correctional facility. All teachers
- 88 employed by the special school must possess a license to teach
- 89 issued by the State Department of Education.
- 90 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 91 and after July 1, 2002.
